8	SUBCHAPTER R. ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON QUALIFICATIONS FOR

10	Sec. 531.701. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:	
11	(1) "Advisory committee" means the Advisory Committee	
12	on Qualifications for Health Care Translators and Interpreters.	
13	(2) "Health care" means medical care, surgical care,	
14	hospital care, or any remedial care provided to diagnose, prevent	
15	alleviate, or cure a patient's injury or illness, including mental	
16	health care.	
17	(3) "Health care interpreter" means a person who is	
18	trained to communicate with a person who has limited English	
19	proficiency or who is deaf or hard of hearing by accurately	
20	conveying in English and the language of the person who has limited	
21	English proficiency or who is deaf or hard of hearing the meaning of	
22	health care related statements made orally.	
23	(4) "Health care practitioner" means an individual who	
24	furnishes patient health care services under a license,	

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- 1 <u>certificate</u>, or registration issued by this state.
- 2 <u>(5) "Health care translator" means a person who is</u>
- 3 trained to communicate in writing with a person with limited
- 4 English proficiency by accurately translating into English and the
- 5 language of the person who has limited English proficiency written
- 6 health care related statements.
- 7 (6) "Person who has limited English proficiency" means
- 8 a person who:
- 9 (A) because of the person's place of birth or
- 10 culture, speaks a language other than English; and
- 11 (B) does not speak English adequately to
- 12 communicate effectively with a health care practitioner.
- 13 Sec. 531.702. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Except as
- 14 otherwise provided by this subchapter or a rule adopted by the
- 15 executive commissioner, the advisory committee is subject to
- 16 <u>Chapter 2110.</u>
- 17 Sec. 531.703. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Advisory
- 18 Committee on Qualifications for Health Care Translators and
- 19 Interpreters is subject to Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset Act). Unless
- 20 continued in existence as provided by this subchapter, the
- 21 committee is abolished and this subchapter expires January 1, 2021.
- Sec. 531.704. ESTABLISHMENT. The executive commissioner
- 23 shall establish the Advisory Committee on Qualifications for Health
- 24 Care Translators and Interpreters.
- Sec. 531.705. MEMBERS. (a) The advisory committee is
- 26 composed of not fewer than 10 members appointed by the executive
- 27 commissioner as provided by this section.

1	(b) The advisory committee must include:		
2	(1) one member who is a representative of a		
3	professional translators and interpreters association;		
4	(2) one member who is a health care interpreter		
5	working with people who have limited English proficiency;		
6	(3) one member who is a health care interpreter		
7	working with people who are deaf or hard of hearing;		
8	(4) one member who is a representative of a mental		
9	health services provider;		
10	(5) one member who is a representative of a hospital;		
11	(6) one member who represents the insurance industry;		
12	(7) one member who represents a business entity that		
13	provides translators and interpreters to health care		
14	practitioners;		
15	(8) one member who represents an organization that		
16	provides services to immigrants and refugees; and		
17	(9) one member who is a representative of ar		
18	institution of higher education.		
19	(c) The remaining members of the advisory committee must		
20	include at least one health care practitioner and additional		
21	members, as determined by the executive commissioner, who represent		
22	the interests of consumers.		
23	Sec. 531.706. DUTIES. (a) The advisory committee shall		
24	establish and recommend qualifications for health care		
25	interpreters and health care translators that include:		
26	(1) for a person to be qualified as a health care		
27	translator, requiring the person to:		

1	(A) fluently understand a written foreign
2	language and demonstrate the ability to accurately translate
3	messages communicated in that language into English and to
4	accurately translate messages communicated in English into that
5	language; and
6	(B) have practical experience as a translator or
7	hold professional certification as a translator; and
8	(2) for a person to be qualified as a health care
9	interpreter, requiring the person to:
10	(A) fluently understand a spoken foreign
11	language and demonstrate the ability to accurately interpret
12	messages communicated in that language into English and to
13	interpret messages communicated in English into that language; and
14	(B) have practical experience as an interpreter
15	or hold professional certification or licensure as an interpreter.
16	(b) The advisory committee shall advise the commission on:
17	(1) the language proficiency required for
18	certification as a health care interpreter or health care
19	<pre>translator;</pre>
20	(2) training requirements for health care
21	<pre>interpreters and health care translators;</pre>
22	(3) standards of practice for health care interpreters
23	and health care translators;
24	(4) the requirements, content, and administration of
25	certification examinations for health care interpreters and health
26	<pre>care translators;</pre>
27	(5) the procedures for testing, qualifying, and

- 1 certifying health care interpreters and health care translators;
- 2 and
- 3 (6) reciprocity agreements with other states.
- 4 (c) The advisory committee shall:
- 5 (1) develop strategies for implementing the
- 6 regulation of health care interpreters and health care translators;
- 7 (2) make recommendations to the commission for any
- 8 legislation necessary to establish and enforce qualifications for
- 9 health care interpreters and health care translators or for the
- 10 adoption of rules by state agencies regulating health care
- 11 practitioners, hospitals, physician offices, and health care
- 12 facilities that hire health care interpreters or health care
- 13 translators; and
- 14 (3) perform other activities assigned by the
- 15 commission related to health care interpreters or health care
- 16 <u>translators</u>.
- Sec. 531.707. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT. A member of the
- 18 advisory committee may not receive compensation, but is entitled to
- 19 reimbursement of the travel expenses incurred by the member while
- 20 conducting the business of the advisory committee, as provided by
- 21 the General Appropriations Act.
- SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2010, the executive
- 23 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 24 establish the Advisory Committee on Qualifications for Health Care
- 25 Translators and Interpreters as required by Subchapter R, Chapter
- 26 531, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
