## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to methods to increase the number of students who 3 participate in school breakfast programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 12, Agriculture Code, is amended by 6 adding Sections 12.044 and 12.045 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 12.044. SCHOOL BREAKFAST PARTICIPATION INITIATIVES.
- 8 (a) In this section, "breakfast program" means the national school
- 9 breakfast program provided for by the Child Nutrition Act of 1966
- 10 (42 U.S.C. Section 1773).

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- 11 (b) Each school district shall instruct its school health
- 12 advisory council to study and recommend to the district methods to
- increase participation in the breakfast program. The school health
- 14 advisory council shall consider the likely benefit of a program to
- 15 educate parents on the importance to their children's health of a
- 16 regular eating schedule that includes breakfast.
- 17 (c) The department shall:
- 18 (1) encourage each school in which 60 percent or more
- 19 of the students qualify for free or reduced-price breakfast to
- 20 offer a free breakfast to all students in the school regardless of
- 21 family income; and
- 22 (2) encourage schools to investigate alternative
- 23 methods of serving breakfast, including serving breakfast after the
- 24 school day has begun.

- 1 Sec. 12.045. SCHOOL BREAKFAST PARTICIPATION EXPANSION
- 2 GRANTS. (a) In this section, "Provision 2" means the method of
- 3 certifying children for free or reduced-price meals under 7 C.F.R.
- 4 Section 245.9(b).
- 5 (b) The department by rule shall establish a competitive
- 6 grant program through which the department will award grants for
- 7 the implementation of school breakfast participation expansion
- 8 programs. The department shall determine the grant period and the
- 9 renewal procedures, if applicable.
- 10 (c) Grant proceeds may be used to fund expenses associated
- 11 with a school breakfast participation expansion program,
- 12 including:
- 13 (1) labor and training costs associated with
- incorporating breakfast into the regular school day;
- 15 (2) the purchase price of insulated containers and
- 16 other equipment used to serve breakfast after the regular school
- 17 day has begun;
- 18 (3) costs associated with an outreach program to
- 19 publicize to parents the school breakfast expansion program; and
- 20 (4) incentive payments to school principals who meet
- 21 goals for increased school breakfast participation.
- 22 (d) Grants under this section may be funded by gift or
- 23 legislative appropriation. The department may receive gifts,
- 24 donations, and grants of money to assist in financing the
- 25 competitive grant program.
- 26 (e) An applicant for a grant under this section must be a
- 27 school district. The applicant may apply for a grant to fund a

1 school breakfast expansion program: 2 (1) for the entire district if the district meets the eligibility requirements under Subsection (f); or 3 4 (2) in one or more schools that meet the eligibility 5 requirements under Subsection (f). 6 (f) A district is eligible to be considered for a grant 7 under this section if: 8 (1) 60 percent or more of the students in the district or the applicable schools receive free or reduced-price meals in 9 10 the 2008-2009 school year; (2) the district or schools do not currently use a 11 12 nontraditional method to serve school breakfast; and (3) the number of students who receive breakfast from 13 14 the district or the applicable schools is less than 50 percent of 15 the number of students who receive lunch from the school. 16 (g) To apply for a grant, an applicant must submit a written application to the department including a school breakfast 17 participation expansion plan that: 18 19 (1) identifies strategies that the district or schools will use to incorporate breakfast into the regular school day and 20 21 increase the number of students who eat school breakfast; (2) indicates whether the district or schools will 22 serve free meals to all students and, if so, indicates whether the 23 24 district or schools will use Provision 2 or another method to ensure

(3) details how the grant proceeds will be used; and

(4) includes a goal for the percentage increase in the

the integrity of claims for free or reduced-price meals;

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- 1 number of students who will eat school breakfast during the grant
- 2 period.
- 3 (h) Each grant recipient must submit a report to the
- 4 department quarterly that indicates:
- 5 (1) how the recipient is using the grant proceeds;
- 6 (2) the amount of grant proceeds the recipient has
- 7 spent; and
- 8 (3) the recipient's progress toward meeting its goal
- 9 under Subsection (g)(4).
- 10 <u>(i) The department shall:</u>
- 11 (1) develop requests for proposals associated with the
- 12 grant program;
- 13 (2) select grant recipients; and
- 14 (3) monitor each recipient's use of grant proceeds.
- SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2009, the Department
- of Agriculture shall establish and implement the school breakfast
- 17 participation expansion grant program under Section 12.045,
- 18 Agriculture Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
