## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT relating to reporting of international shipments of electronic waste. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 361.954(a), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

7 (a) <u>Except as provided by Section 361.9553, the</u> [<del>The</del>] 8 collection, recycling, and reuse provisions of this subchapter 9 apply to computer equipment used and returned to the manufacturer 10 by a consumer in this state and do not impose any obligation on an 11 owner or operator of a solid waste facility.

SECTION 2. Subchapter Y, Chapter 361, Health and Safety
Code, is amended by adding Section 361.9553 to read as follows:

Sec. 361.9553. REPORTS ON INTERNATIONAL SHIPMENTS OF USED
ELECTRONICS. (a) This section is intended to provide consumers of
electronic equipment in this state and other residents of this
state who may give to a business entity in this state electronic
parts or electronic equipment for recycling, reuse, or disposal a
means to inform themselves of the probable destination of the parts
or equipment.

21 (b) A business entity that operates in this state and ships 22 for recycling, reuse, or disposal any sort of electronic parts or 23 electronic equipment to which this subchapter is applicable from 24 this state to an ultimate destination that is located outside of the

No. 284 United States but is not located in a country that is a member of the 1 European Union or of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and 2 Development shall provide a report to the commission annually. The 3 reporting requirement does not apply to electronic equipment that 4 is being shipped for reuse unless the equipment is not functional 5 and is packaged accordingly and does not apply to electronic 6 7 equipment that is being shipped for reuse by returning it to a 8 manufacturer or the manufacturer's agent. The commission shall provide a means for the report to be filed electronically. The 9 report must include: 10 11 (1) the business entity's name, address, and telephone 12 number; (2) the name of the chief executive officer or chief 13 14 financial officer of the business entity; 15 (3) the type and amount of each shipment of electronic parts or electronic equipment transported; 16 (4) the date of each shipment's debarkation; and 17 (5) each shipment's destination country. 18 (c) The commission shall make the report's information 19 publicly available on the commission's website in a timely manner. 20 21 (d) The commission may adopt rules to implement this section. The rules may provide for exemptions from compliance with 22 this section for shipments made for humanitarian reasons or for de 23 24 minimis shipments. SECTION 3. (a) Section 361.9553, Health and Safety Code, as 25 26 added by this Act, applies only to a shipment made on or after the

effective date of this Act. A shipment made before that date is

1 subject to the law in effect on the date the shipment was made, and 2 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

3 (b) The first report required by Section 361.9553, Health 4 and Safety Code, as added by this Act, must cover the period 5 September 1, 2009, to August 31, 2010. That report must be 6 submitted to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality not 7 later than September 30, 2010.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
