A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to electioneering near certain privately owned polling

- 3 places.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 43.031, Election Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (d) If a suitable public building is unavailable, the
- 9 polling place may be located in some other building, including a
- 10 building on a federal military base or facility with the permission
- 11 of the post or base commander, and any charge for its use is an
- 12 election expense. A polling place may not be located in a building
- 13 under this subsection unless electioneering is permitted on the
- 14 building's premises outside any [the] prescribed limits within
- which electioneering is prohibited, except that a polling place may
- 16 be located in a building at which electioneering is not permitted if
- it is the only building available for use as a polling place in the
- 18 election precinct.
- 19 (d-1) If the polling place is located in a building owned by
- 20 <u>a private business, the owner of the business must notify the</u>
- 21 authority holding the election whether electioneering will be
- 22 permitted within the area described by Section 61.003(a).
- SECTION 2. Section 61.003, Election Code, is amended by
- 24 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as

- 1 follows:
- 2 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d), a [A] person
- 3 commits an offense if, during the voting period and within 100 feet
- 4 of an outside door through which a voter may enter the building in
- 5 which a polling place is located, the person:
- 6 (1) loiters; or
- 7 (2) electioneers for or against any candidate,
- 8 measure, or political party.
- 9 (d) This section does not apply to a polling place located
- 10 <u>in a building for which notice was provided under Section</u>
- 11 43.031(d-1) that electioneering was permitted in the area described
- 12 by Subsection (a).
- SECTION 3. Section 61.010(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a person may not
- 16 wear a badge, insignia, emblem, or other similar communicative
- 17 device relating to a candidate, measure, or political party
- 18 appearing on the ballot, or to the conduct of the election, in the
- 19 polling place or within 100 feet of any outside door through which a
- voter may enter the building in which the polling place is located.
- 21 This subsection does not apply to a polling place for which notice
- 22 was provided under Section 43.031(d-1) that electioneering was
- permitted in the area described by Section 61.003(a).
- SECTION 4. Section 62.010(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- 26 (a) If electioneering in the area described by Section
- 27 61.003(a) is prohibited, an [An] election officer shall place one

- 1 or more distance markers at the outer limits of the area within
- 2 which electioneering is prohibited.
- 3 SECTION 5. Section 85.036, Election Code, is amended by
- 4 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (b) to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), during [During]
- 7 the time an early voting polling place is open for the conduct of
- 8 early voting, a person may not electioneer for or against any
- 9 candidate, measure, or political party in or within 100 feet of an
- 10 outside door through which a voter may enter the building or
- 11 structure in which the early voting polling place is located.
- 12 (b) This section does not apply to an early voting polling
- 13 place located in a building owned by a private business, if the
- 14 owner of the business notifies the early voting clerk that
- 15 electioneering is permitted within the area described by Subsection
- 16 <u>(a)</u>.
- 17 (c) During the early voting period, the early voting clerk
- 18 shall keep continuously posted:
- 19 (1) at the entrance to the room or area, as applicable,
- 20 in which the early voting polling place is located, a sign on which
- 21 is printed in large letters "Early Voting Polling Place"; and
- 22 (2) <u>unless electioneering near a polling place is</u>
- 23 <u>permitted under this section</u>, at the outer limits of the area within
- 24 which electioneering is prohibited, a sign on which is printed in
- 25 large letters "Distance Marker. No electioneering between this
- 26 point and the entrance to the early voting polling place."
- 27 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
