5 (e) American Sign Language is a language for purposes of 6 Subsection (a)(2)(A). A public <u>high</u> school may offer an elective 7 course in the language. <u>The elective high school course may be</u> 8 <u>offered through teleconferencing or another electronic means</u>.

9 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2010-2011 10 school year.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
