H.B. No. 315

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the instruction of American Sign Language in public  
3 high schools.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 28.002(a) and (e), Education Code, are  
6 amended to read as follows:

7 (a) Each school district that offers kindergarten through  
8 grade 12 shall offer, as a required curriculum:

9 (1) a foundation curriculum that includes:

10 (A) English language arts;

11 (B) mathematics;

12 (C) science; and

13 (D) social studies, consisting of Texas, United  
14 States, and world history, government, and geography; and

15 (2) an enrichment curriculum that includes:

16 (A) to the extent possible, subject to Subsection  
17 (e), languages other than English;

18 (B) health, with emphasis on the importance of  
19 proper nutrition and exercise;

20 (C) physical education;

21 (D) fine arts;

22 (E) economics, with emphasis on the free  
23 enterprise system and its benefits;

24 (F) career and technology education;

1 (G) technology applications; and

2 (H) religious literature, including the Hebrew  
3 Scriptures (Old Testament) and New Testament, and its impact on  
4 history and literature.

5 (e) American Sign Language is a language for purposes of  
6 Subsection (a)(2)(A). A public high school shall ~~[may]~~ offer an  
7 elective course in the language, and another public school may  
8 offer an elective course in the language. The required elective  
9 high school course may not be offered through teleconferencing or  
10 another electronic means, but must be offered through in-person  
11 instruction by a teacher in the classroom.

12 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2010-2011  
13 school year.

14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
18 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
