- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 25.085(b), Education Code, is amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (b) Unless specifically exempted by Section 25.086, a child
- 7 who is at least <u>five</u> [six] years of age <u>on September 1 of the school</u>
- 8 <u>year</u>, or who is younger than <u>five</u> [six] years of age <u>on September 1</u>
- 9 of the school year and has previously been enrolled in
- 10 prekindergarten or kindergarten [first grade], and who has not yet
- 11 reached the child's 18th birthday shall attend school.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 29.009, Education Code, is amended to

- 14 Sec. 29.009. PUBLIC NOTICE CONCERNING PRESCHOOL PROGRAMS
- 15 FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES. Each school district shall develop
- 16 a system to notify the population in the district with children who

- SECTION 3. Sections 42.003(a) and (d), Education Code, are

- 1 older and under 21 years of age and has not graduated from high

- 4 age and has been admitted by a school district to complete the

- 6 (d) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a student younger than
- 7 five years of age on September 1 of the school year who is not
- 8 otherwise [is] entitled to the benefits of the Foundation School
- 9 Program is entitled to the benefits of the program if:
- 10 (1) the student performs satisfactorily on the
- 11 assessment instrument administered under Section 39.023(a) to
- 12 students in the third grade; and
- 13 (2) the district has adopted a policy for admitting
- 14 students younger than five years of age.
- 15 SECTION 4. Sections 25.085(c) and 42.003(c), Education
- 16 Code, are repealed.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
- 18 school year.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
