Sections 25.112(a) and (d), Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 (a) Except as otherwise authorized by this section, a school 7 district may not enroll more than 18 students in a prekindergarten 8 class or 22 students in a kindergarten, first, second, third, or 9 fourth grade class. <u>A limit imposed by this subsection</u> [That 10 11 limitation] does not apply during: 12 (1) any 12-week period of the school year selected by the district, in the case of a district whose average daily 13 14 attendance is adjusted under Section 42.005(c); or (2) the last 12 weeks of any school year in the case of 15 any other district. 16 (d) On application of a school district, the commissioner 17 may except the district from <u>a</u> [the] limit <u>imposed by</u> [in] 18 Subsection (a) if the commissioner finds the limit works an undue 19 hardship on the district. An exception expires at the end of the 20 21 semester for which it is granted, and the commissioner may not grant an exception for [+ 22 23 [(1)] more than one semester at a time. 24 SECTION 2. Section 25.113(a), Education Code, is amended to

(a) A campus or district that is granted an exception under
Section 25.112(d) from class size limits shall provide written
notice of the exception to the parent of or person standing in
parental relation to each student affected by the exception. The
notice must be in conspicuous bold or underlined print and:

7 (1) specify the class for which an exception from <u>a</u>
8 [the] limit imposed by Section 25.112(a) was granted;

9 (2) state the number of children in the class for which 10 the exception was granted; and

(3) be included in a regular mailing or other communication from the campus or district, such as information sent home with students.

SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010 school year.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
