

AN ACT

relating to abolishing the office of inspector of hides and animals.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. (a) The office of inspector of hides and animals is abolished.

(b) Any records in the custody of an inspector of hides and animals are transferred to the county clerk of the county previously served by the inspector.

SECTION 2. Section 52.092(e), Election Code, is amended to read as follows:

(e) County offices shall be listed in the following order:

- (1) county judge;
- (2) judge, county court at law;
- (3) judge, county criminal court;
- (4) judge, county probate court;
- (5) county attorney;
- (6) district clerk;
- (7) district and county clerk;
- (8) county clerk;
- (9) sheriff;
- (10) sheriff and tax assessor-collector;
- (11) county tax assessor-collector;
- (12) county treasurer;

1 (13) county school trustee (county with population of
2 3.3 million or more);

3 (14) county surveyor[+]

4 [~~(15) inspector of hides and animals~~].

5 SECTION 3. Section 172.024(a), Election Code, is amended to
6 read as follows:

7 (a) The filing fee for a candidate for nomination in the
8 general primary election is as follows:

24 SECTION 4. Section 87.012, Local Government Code, is

25 amended to read as follows:

26 Sec. 87.012. OFFICERS SUBJECT TO REMOVAL. The district

27 judge may, under this subchapter, remove from office:

- 1 (1) a district attorney;
- 2 (2) a county attorney;
- 3 (3) a county judge;
- 4 (4) a county commissioner;
- 5 (5) a county clerk;
- 6 (6) a district clerk;
- 7 (7) a district and county clerk;
- 8 (8) a county treasurer;
- 9 (9) a sheriff;
- 10 (10) a county surveyor;
- 11 (11) a county tax assessor-collector;
- 12 (12) a constable;
- 13 (13) ~~[an inspector of hides and animals,~~
- 14 ~~[(14)]~~ a justice of the peace; and
- 15 (14) ~~[(15)]~~ a county officer, not otherwise named by
- 16 this section, whose office is created under the constitution or
- 17 other law of this state.

18 SECTION 5. Section 87.041(a), Local Government Code, is
19 amended to read as follows:

20 (a) The commissioners court of a county may fill a vacancy
21 in the office of:

- 22 (1) county judge;
- 23 (2) county clerk;
- 24 (3) district and county clerk;
- 25 (4) sheriff;
- 26 (5) county attorney;
- 27 (6) county treasurer;

- 1 (7) county surveyor;
- 2 (8) [~~inspector of hides and animals,~~
- 3 ~~(9)~~] county tax assessor-collector;
- 4 (9) [~~(10)~~] justice of the peace; or
- 5 (10) [~~(11)~~] constable.

6 SECTION 6. Sections 148.044, 148.067, and 148.068,

7 Agriculture Code, are repealed.

8 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

12 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
