A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the crediting and charging of investment gains and 3 losses on the assets held in trust by the Texas Municipal Retirement System and providing a guaranteed minimum credit to employee 4 5 accounts. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 855.110, Government Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as 8 follows: 9 The board of trustees shall adopt rates and tables that 10 (a) 11 the board considers necessary for the retirement system after 12 considering the results of the actuary's investigation of the mortality and service experience of the system's members and 13 14 annuitants. In adopting rates and tables, the board of trustees shall adopt a discount rate that is not less than five percent in 15 16 developing an annuity purchase rate. (d) In this section: 17 18 (1) "Annuity purchase rate" means the present value factor used to convert reserves to a monthly annuity based on the 19 post-retirement discount rate assumption and the life expectancy of 20 21 the retiree or beneficiary or both the retiree and the beneficiary at retirement under the selected form of payment. 22 23 (2) "Discount rate" means the interest rate used in 24 determining the present value of future cash flows.

Section 855.308(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 8 In addition to amounts credited or charged [deposited] 9 (a) as provided by Section 855.307, the retirement system shall credit 10 to [deposit in] the account of a participating municipality in the 11 municipality accumulation fund all prior service contributions 12 made by the municipality to the retirement system. 13 14 SECTION 6. Section 855.310, Government Code, is amended to 15 read as follows: Sec. 855.310. INTEREST FUND. (a) The amount in the 16 17 interest fund must accurately reflect the determination and allocation of net investment income or loss [The retirement system 18 shall deposit in the interest fund all income, interest, and 19 dividends from deposits and investments authorized by this chapter. 20 21 The system shall credit the amount of an adjustment made in accordance with Section 855.320 to the interest fund]. 22 The retirement system shall determine net investment 23 (b) 24 income or loss annually as of December 31 in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and shall allocate that 25 amount each year [On December 31 of each year, the retirement system 26 shall transfer money from the interest fund] in accordance with 27

2 SECTION 7. Sections 855.311(c) and (e), Government Code, 3 are amended to read as follows:

4 (c) The retirement system shall credit <u>or charge</u> to the 5 interest reserve account, general reserves account, and 6 distributive benefits account <u>amounts allocated</u> [interest] in 7 accordance with Section 855.317.

8 (e) If the board of trustees determines that the amount 9 credited to the distributive benefits account on December 31 of any 10 year is sufficient to do so, the board by resolution may:

(1) authorize the distribution and payment of all or part of the money credited to the account to persons who were annuitants on that day in the ratio of the rate of the monthly benefit of each annuitant to the total of all annuity payments made by the system for the final month of the year; or

16 (2) authorize the distribution of all or part of the 17 amount credited to the account to [+

18 [(A)] each member's individual account in the 19 employees saving fund as supplemental interest in the ratio of the 20 amount of [current] interest paid on the individual's account to 21 the [current] interest paid to all individual accounts for the 22 year[; and

23 [(B) each participating municipality's account 24 in the municipality accumulation fund as supplemental interest in 25 the ratio of the current interest allowed on the account of the 26 municipality to the total current interest paid to all 27 municipalities' accounts for the year].

SECTION 8. Section 855.312(b), Government Code, is amended 1 2 to read as follows:

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3 The board of trustees by resolution recorded in its (b) 4 minutes shall transfer from the interest reserve account of the 5 endowment fund to the expense fund the amount that exceeds the 6 amount needed to provide adequate reserves as provided by Section 7 855.317 [against insufficient earnings on investments and against 8 special and contingency requirements of other funds of the system] and that is needed to pay the system's estimated expenses for the 9 fiscal year. 10

SECTION 9. Section 855.316, Government Code, is amended to 11 read as follows: 12

Sec. 855.316. INTEREST RATES. [(a)] Unless this subtitle 13 expressly specifies [states that interest is computed using the 14 15 current interest rate or] another [specified] rate of interest, for periods after December 31, 2008, the rate of interest is five 16 17 percent compounded annually, plus any other amounts the board of trustees is expressly authorized to provide. Notwithstanding any 18 other provision in this chapter, the interest credited to the 19 employees saving fund in a calendar year may not be less than five 20 21 percent as allocated under Section 855.317(a) [computed using the rate of: 22

of trustees shall make the following allocations from the interest 1 2 fund that in the aggregate equal the net investment income or loss for the year [transfer from the interest fund the following 3 4 amounts]: 5 (1) to the current service annuity reserve fund, 6 interest on the mean amount in the current service annuity reserve 7 fund during that year; 8 (2) to the supplemental disability benefits fund, 9 interest on the mean amount in the supplemental disability benefits 10 fund during that year; (3) to the supplemental death benefits fund, interest 11 on the mean amount in the supplemental death benefits fund during 12 that year; 13 to the <u>accounts in the</u> municipality accumulation 14 (4) 15 fund, an amount derived by applying a positive or negative rate, as determined by the board of trustees in its sole discretion to the 16 17 January 1 balances of that year for each of those accounts [current interest on the amount in the municipality accumulation fund on 18 January 1 of that year]; 19 (5) to the interest reserve account of the endowment 20 21 fund, a positive or negative amount as determined by the board of trustees in its sole discretion [current interest on the amount in 22 the endowment fund on January 1 of that year]; and 23 24 (6) to the employees saving fund, [current] interest 25 on the sum of the accumulated contributions in the employees saving fund credited on January 1 of that year to all persons who are 26 members on December 31 of that year before any transfers for 27

No. 360 retirement effective December 31 of that year are made. 1 2 In making allocations under this section, the board of (b) trustees shall, without regard to the amount of net investment 3 income or loss for the calendar year, first allocate interest as 4 specified in Section 855.316 to those funds or accounts referenced 5 6 in Subsections (a)(1), (2), (3), and (6). The board shall then allocate the remaining net investment income or loss between the 7 8 funds or accounts referenced in Subsections (a)(4) and (5) in rates or amounts determined by the board in its sole discretion. 9 The board of trustees shall accumulate the amount of assets in 10 [transfer to] the interest reserve account of the endowment fund 11 [the portion of the amount remaining in the interest fund after the 12 transfers required by Subsection (a) are made] that the board in its 13 14 sole discretion determines is necessary: 15 (1)to provide adequate reserves to: (A) mitigate the effects of future investment 16 17 return volatility and [against] insufficient net investment income; and 18 (B) provide reasonable rate stabilization for 19 participating municipalities [future earnings on investments to 20 21 allow interest on the retirement system's funds]; (2) to provide adequate reserves against special and 22 contingency requirements of other funds of the system; and 23 24 (3) to provide the amount required for the 25 administration expenses of the system for the following year. SECTION 12. Section 855.320, Government Code, is repealed. 26 SECTION 13. This Act takes effect immediately if 27 it

1 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 2 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 3 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 4 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
