## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to a fixed tuition rate provided by general academic
- 3 teaching institutions and public lower-division institutions of
- 4 higher education to certain undergraduate students.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 54.016 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 54.016. FIXED TUITION RATE FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS.
- 9 (a) In this section:
- 10 (1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
- 11 Education Coordinating Board.
- 12 (2) "General academic teaching institution," "public
- 13 junior college," "public state college," and "public technical
- institute" have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003.
- 15 (3) "Lower-division institution of higher education"
- 16 means a public junior college, public state college, or public
- 17 technical institute.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided by this section, in a
- 19 <u>semester or other academic term, the governing board of a general</u>
- 20 academic teaching institution or lower-division institution of
- 21 higher education may not charge tuition to an undergraduate student
- 22 under Section 54.0513, or under any other law granting the
- 23 institution discretion to set the tuition rate, at a rate that
- 24 exceeds the rate the institution charged to the student during the

- 1 first semester or other academic term that the student enrolled at
- 2 the institution if the student is currently and at all times while
- 3 enrolled at the institution has been a resident of this state for
- 4 purposes of Subchapter B or was otherwise entitled to pay tuition at
- 5 the rate provided for residents of this state.
- 6 (c) For a student enrolled at a general academic teaching
- 7 institution other than a public state college, Subsection (b) does
- 8 not apply to the student after:
- 9 <u>(1) the fourth anniversary of the date the student</u>
- 10 first enrolls at any public institution of higher education,
- 11 regardless of whether the student transfers among any public or
- 12 private institutions of higher education after the initial
- 13 enrollment, if the student is enrolled in a degree program of four
- 14 years or less; or
- 15 (2) the fifth anniversary of the date the student
- 16 first enrolls at any public institution of higher education,
- 17 regardless of whether the student transfers among any public or
- 18 private institutions of higher education after the initial
- 19 enrollment, if the student is enrolled in a degree program of more
- 20 than four years.
- 21 (d) For a student enrolled at a lower-division institution
- of higher education, Subsection (b) does not apply to the student
- 23 after the second anniversary of the date the student first enrolls
- 24 at any lower-division institution of higher education, regardless
- 25 of whether the student transfers among any public or private
- 26 institutions of higher education after the initial enrollment.
- 27 (e) Each general academic teaching institution or

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- 1 lower-division institution of higher education shall notify each
- 2 entering undergraduate student, including each undergraduate
- 3 student who transfers to the institution, of the eligibility
- 4 requirements for a fixed tuition rate under this section.
- 5 (f) In consultation with the general academic teaching
- 6 institutions and lower-division institutions of higher education,
- 7 the coordinating board shall adopt any rules the coordinating board
- 8 considers appropriate for the administration of this section.
- 9 (g) This section does not apply to a student who enters a
- 10 general academic teaching institution or lower-division
- 11 <u>institution of higher education for the first time before the 2010</u>
- 12 fall semester. This subsection expires January 1, 2016.
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
