5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 681, Transportation Code, is amended by
7	adding Section 681.013 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 681.013. DISMISSAL OF CHARGE; ADMINISTRATIVE FEE. (a)
9	In this section, "working day" means any day other than a Saturday,
10	a Sunday, or a holiday on which county offices are closed.
11	(b) The court shall:
12	(1) dismiss a charge for an offense under Section
13	<u>681.011(b)(1) if:</u>
14	(A) the vehicle displayed a disabled parking
15	placard that was not valid as expired;
16	(B) the defendant remedies the defect by renewing
17	the expired disabled parking placard within 20 working days from
18	the date of the offense or before the defendant's first court
19	appearance date, whichever is later; and
20	(C) the disabled parking placard has not been
21	expired for more than 60 days; and
22	(2) assess an administrative fee not to exceed \$20
23	when the charge has been remedied.
24	(c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b)(1)(C), the court may

dismiss a charge of unlawfully parking a vehicle in a space designated specifically for persons with disabilities, if at the time of the offense the defendant's vehicle displays a disabled parking placard that has been expired for more than 60 days. SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only

6 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 7 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 8 governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and 9 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For 10 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the 11 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was 12 committed before that date.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
