4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 111, Tax Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 111.00457 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 111.00457. INFORMATION RELATING TO OTHER PERMIT OR
8	LICENSE REQUIREMENTS. (a) The comptroller shall include the
9	following statement on each application for a permit or license
10	issued by the comptroller:
11	WARNING. You may be required to obtain an
12	additional permit or license from the State of Texas or
13	from a local governmental entity to conduct business.
14	A listing of links relating to acquiring licenses,
15	permits, and registrations from the State of Texas is
16	available online at
17	http://www.TexasOnline.com/portal/tol/en/9/1. You
18	may also want to contact the municipality and county in
19	which you will conduct business to determine any local
20	governmental requirements.
21	(b) The statement required by Subsection (a) must be placed
22	in a prominent separate section on the last page of the application,
23	on the last line above the applicant signature line, and in bold
24	typeface that is at least as large as any other typeface appearing

- 1 on the page.
- 2 (c) The comptroller shall revise the statement required by
- 3 Subsection (a) as necessary to reflect any change in the Internet
- 4 address that provides the listing of links.
- 5 SECTION 2. Not later than the 60th day after the effective
- 6 date of this Act, the comptroller of public accounts shall modify
- 7 each application for a permit or license issued by the comptroller
- 8 as necessary to comply with Section 111.00457, Tax Code, as added by
- 9 this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
