| 4 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 5 | SECTION 1. Chapter 73, Education Code, is amended by adding |
| 6 | Subchapter I to read as follows: |
| 7 | SUBCHAPTER I. COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM TO PROMOTE EARLY LITERACY |
| 8 | Sec. 73.601. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: |
| 9 | (1) "Competitive grant program" means the competitive |

- 9 (1) "Competitive grant program" means the competitive
 10 grant program to promote early literacy established under this
 11 subchapter.
- 12 <u>(2) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher</u> 13 Education Coordinating Board.
- 14 (3) "Health care practitioner" has the meaning
 15 assigned by Section 112.001, Occupations Code.
- 16 (4) "Health science center" means The University of

 Texas Health Science Center at Houston.
- 18 <u>(5) "Literacy program" means a program to promote</u>
 19 early literacy.
- 20 Sec. 73.602. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM TO
 21 PROMOTE EARLY LITERACY. (a) The University of Texas Health Science
 22 Center at Houston shall establish a competitive grant program to
 23 promote early literacy through which the health science center will
 24 award grants for the implementation of literacy programs, or the

- 1 expansion of existing programs, and for the operation of those
- 2 programs for a period of not less than two years.
- 3 (b) The health science center shall award grants under the
- 4 program to applicants, including applicants operating existing
- 5 programs, in a manner that ensures that the literacy programs
- 6 collectively:
- 7 (1) operate in multiple communities that are
- 8 geographically distributed throughout this state; and
- 9 (2) provide program services to approximately 100,000
- 10 <u>families</u>.
- 11 Sec. 73.603. LITERACY PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS. (a)
- 12 literacy program funded through a grant awarded under this
- 13 subchapter must:
- 14 (1) strictly adhere to the program model developed by
- 15 the Reach Out and Read National Center, including any clinical,
- 16 programmatic, and data collection requirements of that model;
- 17 (2) provide matching funds in an amount equal to the
- amount of the grant funds awarded under this subchapter; and
- 19 (3) require that health care practitioners volunteer
- 20 to:
- 21 (A) in conjunction with performing well-child
- 22 <u>examinations</u>, encourage parents to read to their children and teach
- 23 <u>their children to read</u>, and provide books to children;
- 24 (B) maintain waiting rooms that encourage
- 25 <u>children to read; and</u>
- 26 (C) provide services designed to increase the
- 27 school readiness of children receiving program services.

- 1 (b) Matching funds under Subsection (a)(2) may include
- 2 in-kind contributions.
- 3 Sec. 73.604. APPLICATION. (a) A public or private entity,
- 4 including a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of
- 5 this state, may apply for a grant under this subchapter.
- 6 (b) To apply for a grant, an applicant must submit a written
- 7 application to the health science center on a form prescribed by the
- 8 coordinating board in consultation with the Reach Out and Read
- 9 National Center.
- 10 <u>(c)</u> The application must:
- 11 (1) require the applicant to provide data on the
- 12 number of low-income families residing in the community in which
- 13 the applicant proposes to operate or expand a literacy program and
- 14 provide a description of existing services available to those
- 15 families;
- 16 (2) describe the ongoing monitoring and evaluation
- 17 process to which a grant recipient is subject under Section 73.608,
- 18 including the recipient's obligation to collect and provide
- 19 information requested by the health science center under Section
- 20 73.608(d); and
- 21 (3) require the applicant to provide other relevant
- information as determined by the health science center.
- 23 Sec. 73.605. ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS IN AWARDING GRANTS.
- 24 In addition to the factors described by Sections 73.602(b) and
- 25 73.603, in determining whether to award a grant to an applicant
- under this subchapter, the health science center shall consider:
- 27 (1) the demonstrated need for a literacy program in

- 1 the community in which the applicant proposes to operate or expand
- 2 the program, which may be determined by considering:
- 3 (A) the poverty rate, the crime rate, the number
- 4 of births to Medicaid recipients, the rate of poor birth outcomes,
- 5 and the incidence of referrals of elementary school students for
- 6 remedial instruction or special education services, and of child
- 7 <u>abuse and neglect, during a prescribed period in the community; and</u>
- 8 (B) the need to enhance school readiness in the
- 9 community;
- 10 (2) the applicant's ability to participate in ongoing
- 11 monitoring and performance evaluations under Section 73.608,
- 12 including the applicant's ability to collect and provide
- information requested by the health science center under Section
- 14 73.608(d);
- 15 (3) the applicant's ability to adhere to the literacy
- 16 program standards adopted under Section 73.606;
- 17 (4) the applicant's ability to develop broad-based
- 18 community support for implementing or expanding a literacy program,
- 19 as applicable; and
- 20 (5) the applicant's history of developing and
- 21 sustaining innovative, high-quality programs that meet the needs of
- 22 <u>families and communities.</u>
- Sec. 73.606. LITERACY PROGRAM STANDARDS. The coordinating
- 24 board, with the assistance of the Reach Out and Read National
- 25 Center, shall adopt standards for the literacy programs funded
- 26 <u>under this subchapter. The standards must adhere to the Reach Out</u>
- 27 and Read national program model standards and guidelines that have

- 1 been tested and replicated in multiple communities.
- 2 Sec. 73.607. USE OF AWARDED GRANT FUNDS. The grant funds
- 3 awarded under this subchapter may be used only to cover costs
- 4 related to implementing or expanding and operating a literacy
- 5 program, including costs related to:
- 6 <u>(1) administering the program;</u>
- 7 (2) training and managing health care practitioners
- 8 who volunteer to participate in the program; and
- 9 (3) purchasing discounted books for use in the
- 10 literacy program.
- 11 Sec. 73.608. PROGRAM MONITORING AND EVALUATION; ANNUAL
- 12 COMMITTEE REPORTS. (a) The coordinating board, with the
- 13 assistance of the Reach Out and Read National Center, shall adopt
- 14 performance indicators that are designed to measure a grant
- 15 recipient's performance with respect to the literacy program
- standards adopted under Section 73.606.
- 17 (b) The health science center shall:
- 18 <u>(1) use the performance indicators adopted under</u>
- 19 Subsection (a) to continuously monitor and formally evaluate on an
- 20 annual basis the performance of each grant recipient; and
- 21 (2) prepare and submit an annual report, not later
- than December 1 of each year, to the Senate Education Committee, or
- 23 <u>its successor, and the House Public Education Committee, or its</u>
- 24 successor, regarding the performance of each grant recipient during
- 25 the preceding state fiscal year with respect to providing literacy
- 26 program services.
- 27 (c) The report required under Subsection (b)(2) must

- 1 <u>include:</u>
- 2 (1) the number of low-income children receiving
- 3 literacy program services;
- 4 (2) the number of health care practitioners who
- 5 participate in the program and the estimated value of the services
- 6 provided by those practitioners under the program; and
- 7 (3) the extent to which each grant recipient adhered
- 8 to the Reach Out and Read national program model.
- 9 (d) On request, each grant recipient shall timely collect
- 10 and provide data and any other information required by the health
- 11 science center to monitor and evaluate the recipient or to prepare
- 12 the report required by this section.
- 13 Sec. 73.609. COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM FUNDING. (a) The
- 14 health science center shall actively seek and apply for any
- 15 available federal funds to assist in financing the competitive
- 16 grant program established under this subchapter.
- 17 (b) The health science center may use appropriated funds
- 18 from the state government and may accept gifts, donations, and
- 19 grants of money from the federal government, local governments,
- 20 private corporations, or other persons to assist in financing the
- 21 <u>competitive grant program.</u>
- 22 SECTION 2. (a) As required by Section 73.609, Education
- 23 Code, as added by this Act, The University of Texas Health Science
- 24 Center at Houston shall, as soon as practicable, apply for any
- 25 available federal funds to assist in financing the competitive
- 26 grant program under Subchapter I, Chapter 73, Education Code, as
- 27 added by this Act.

(b) Not later than September 1, 2010, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall adopt necessary rules for, and The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston shall establish and implement, the competitive grant program required by Subchapter I, Chapter 73, Education Code, as added by this Act.

- 6 (c) Not later than December 1, 2009, The University of Texas 7 Health Science Center at Houston shall submit a report to the Senate Education Committee, or its successor, and the House Public 8 9 Education Committee, or its successor, regarding implementation and status of the competitive grant program required 10 by Subchapter I, Chapter 73, Education Code, as added by this Act. 11
- (d) Not later than December 1, 2011, The University of Texas
 Health Science Center at Houston shall submit the initial annual
 report required by Section 73.608(b)(2), Education Code, as added
 by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
