## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the authority of a dental hygienist to provide services 3 in certain facilities. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 262.1515, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 262.1515. DELEGATION OF DUTIES TO DENTAL HYGIENIST 7 PRACTICING IN CERTAIN [<del>LONG-TERM CARE</del>] [<del>AND</del> 8 FACILITIES SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTERS]. 9 SECTION 2. Sections 262.1515(a), (c), and (e), Occupations 10 11 Code, are amended to read as follows: 12 (a) A licensed dentist may delegate a service, task, or procedure, pursuant to this section, to a dental hygienist, without 13 complying with Section 262.151(a)(2) if: 14 (1) the dental hygienist has at least two years' 15 experience in the practice of dental hygiene; and 16 (2) the service, task, or procedure is performed in 17 one of the following locations: 18 (A) a nursing facility as defined in Section 19 242.301, Health and Safety Code; [or] 20 21 (B) a school-based health center established 22 under Subchapter B, Chapter 38, Education Code; or 23 (C) a community health center as defined by 24 Section 136.002, Human Resources Code.

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(c) A dental hygienist may <u>only</u> [not] perform [a second set
<del>of</del>] delegated tasks or procedures with respect to a patient for six</del>
<u>months unless</u> [until] the patient has been examined by a dentist in
compliance with Section 262.151(a)(2).

5 (e) The [nursing] facility <u>under Subsection (a)(2)</u> [<del>or</del> 6 <del>school-based health center</del>] shall note each delegated service, 7 task, or procedure performed by the dental hygienist under this 8 section in the patient's medical records.

9 SECTION 3. Section 262.152, Occupations Code, is amended to 10 read as follows:

Sec. 262.152. PERFORMANCE OF DELEGATED DUTIES. <u>Except as</u> <u>provided by Section 262.1515, a</u> [A] dental hygienist shall practice dental hygiene:

14 (1) in the dental office of a supervising dentist15 licensed by the board; or

16 (2) in an alternate setting, including a nursing home, 17 the patient's home, a school, a hospital, a state institution, a 18 public health clinic, or another institution, under the supervision 19 of a supervising dentist.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
