- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 661, Government Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 661.2021 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 661.2021. ADDITIONAL SICK LEAVE FOR PEACE OFFICERS AND 8 CORRECTIONS OFFICERS. (a) This section applies only to:
- 9 (1) a state employee who is a peace officer under
  10 Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, and commissioned by a
  11 state officer or state agency; and
- 12 (2) a member of the class of employees of the

  13 institutional division or the state jail division of the Texas

  14 Department of Criminal Justice formally designated as custodial

  15 personnel under Section 615.006 by the Texas Board of Criminal

  16 Justice or its predecessor in function.
- 17 (b) In addition to the sick leave provided under Section
  18 661.202(c), a person described by Subsection (a) who works overtime
  19 during a month accrues additional sick leave for the month as
  20 follows:
- 21 (1) less than 20 hours of overtime during the month, 22 one hour of sick leave;
- 23 (2) at least 20 hours but less than 40 hours of 24 overtime during the month, two hours of sick leave;

1	(3) at least 40 hours but less than 60 hours of
2	overtime during the month, three hours of sick leave;
3	(4) at least 60 hours but less than 80 hours of
4	overtime during the month, four hours of sick leave; and
5	(5) 80 hours or more of overtime during the month, five
6	hours of sick leave.
7	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
8	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
9	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
