A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to allowing customers to opt out of provider of last resort
- 3 default service.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.101(b), Utilities Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (b) A customer is entitled:
- 8 (1) to be informed about rights and opportunities in
- 9 the transition to a competitive electric industry;
- 10 (2) to choose the customer's retail electric provider
- 11 consistent with this chapter, to have that choice honored, and to
- 12 assume that the customer's chosen provider will not be changed
- without the customer's informed consent;
- 14 (3) to have access to providers of energy efficiency
- 15 services, to on-site distributed generation, and to providers of
- energy generated by renewable energy resources;
- 17 (4) to be served by a provider of last resort that
- 18 offers a commission-approved standard service package;
- 19 <u>(4-a) to opt out of and to reinstate provider of last</u>
- 20 resort default service as provided by Section 39.106;
- 21 (5) to receive sufficient information to make an
- 22 informed choice of service provider;
- 23 (6) to be protected from unfair, misleading, or
- 24 deceptive practices, including protection from being billed for

- 1 services that were not authorized or provided; and
- 2 (7) to have an impartial and prompt resolution of
- 3 disputes with its chosen retail electric provider and transmission
- 4 and distribution utility.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 39.106, Utilities Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsections (h) and (i) to read as follows:
- 7 (h) The commission by rule shall establish a procedure by
- 8 which customers may opt out of and reinstate provider of last resort
- 9 default service. The commission shall establish and maintain a
- 10 <u>list of all customers who choose to opt out of provider of last</u>
- 11 resort default service and share the list with retail electric
- 12 providers. The commission shall notify customers that opting out
- of provider of last resort default service will result in a loss of
- 14 electric service if the customer's chosen electric retail provider
- would otherwise be required to transfer the customer to a provider
- 16 <u>of last resort under commission rules.</u>
- 17 (i) The commission by rule shall establish a provider of
- 18 last resort public education program to inform consumers about the
- 19 default services offered by providers of last resort and the
- 20 procedure by which customers may opt out of and reinstate the
- 21 <u>default services of providers of last resort.</u>
- 22 SECTION 3. The Public Utility Commission of Texas shall
- 23 establish the opt-out procedure, opt-out participant list, and
- 24 provider of last resort public education program required by
- 25 Sections 39.106(h) and (i), Utilities Code, as added by this Act,
- 26 not later than January 1, 2010.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
