5	Sec. 490D.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

Twenty</u> 21 percent of the funds available for grant programs under this 22 chapter must be reserved for job skills training programs that 23 <u>serve the unemployed and individuals whose incomes are at or below</u> 24 <u>200 percent of the federal poverty level.</u>

25 <u>Sec. 490D.036. REPORT. (a) Not later than the 30th day</u> 26 <u>after the date funding for a grant under this chapter ends, the</u> 27 <u>grant recipient shall submit a report to the commission that</u>

1 SECTION 4. Implementation of the program under Subchapter 2 C, Chapter 490D, Government Code, as added by this Act, is 3 contingent on appropriation of funding by the legislature.

4 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
