A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| 1 | AN ACT |
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- relating to annual stipends provided to public school teachers who serve as mentors to other public school teachers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.458, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (b-1), (c-1), (c-2),
- 7 and (c-3) to read as follows:
- 8 (b-1) The board of trustees of a school district that
- 9 assigns teachers to serve as mentors under this section shall:
- 10 (1) adopt a policy, consistent with any rules adopted
- 11 by the commissioner under this section, that governs the selection
- and duties of teachers assigned to serve as mentors; and
- (2) ensure that a mentor teacher stipend under this
- 14 section is provided only to a teacher who fulfills the duties
- 15 specified in the policy required by Subdivision (1).
- 16 (c) From the funds allocated under Section 21.703 or other
- 17 <u>funds</u> appropriated to the agency for purposes of this section, the
- 18 commissioner shall adopt rules and provide funding to school
- 19 districts that assign mentor teachers under this section. Funding
- 20 provided to districts under this section may be used only for
- 21 providing:
- 22 (1) mentor teacher stipends <u>in the amount of \$1,000</u>
- 23 per teacher for each school year during which the teacher serves as
- 24 a mentor;

- 1 (2) scheduled time for mentor teachers to provide
- 2 mentoring to assigned classroom teachers; and
- 3 (3) mentoring support through providers of mentor
- 4 training.
- 5 (c-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (c), a school district may
- 6 use funds provided under that subsection for a purpose authorized
- 7 by Subsection (c)(2) or (3) only to the extent that funds remain
- 8 after fully funding the stipends authorized by Subsection (c)(1).
- 9 (c-2) Subsection (c-1) does not create a property right of a
- 10 <u>teacher to receive a stipend.</u> If a school district receives
- insufficient funds to fully fund the stipends, the district shall
- 12 reduce the stipend the district pays to each teacher serving as a
- 13 mentor proportionately so that each teacher serving as a mentor
- 14 receives the same amount of money.
- 15 (c-3) A stipend a teacher receives under this section is not
- 16 considered in determining whether the district is paying the
- teacher the minimum monthly salary under Section 21.402.
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 21.703(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- 20 (a) Each state fiscal year, the commissioner shall deposit
- 21 the sum of \$1,000 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers in
- 22 this state to the credit of the educator excellence fund in the
- 23 general revenue fund. Each state fiscal year, the agency shall use:
- 24 (1) from the funds in the educator excellence fund,
- 25 the amount necessary to fund stipends under Section 21.458 for
- 26 teachers who serve as mentors to other teachers, provided that not
- 27 more than \$70 million may be used for this purpose each fiscal year;

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- 1 (2) not more than \$100 million of any remaining [the]
- 2 funds in the educator excellence fund to provide grant awards under
- 3 the awards for student achievement program established under
- 4 Subchapter N; and
- 5 (3) $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ any remaining funds in the educator
- 6 excellence fund to provide a qualifying school district a grant in
- 7 an amount determined by:
- 8 (A) dividing the amount of remaining money
- 9 available for distribution in the educator excellence fund by the
- 10 total number of students in average daily attendance in qualifying
- 11 districts for that fiscal year; and
- 12 (B) multiplying the amount determined under
- 13 Paragraph (A) by the number of students in average daily attendance
- 14 in the district.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
