SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only 19 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 20 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 21 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the 22 23 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of 24 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that 25 26 date.
