- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 201.001(a), Transportation Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) In this title:
- 9 (1) "Commissioner" means the commissioner of
- 10 transportation ["Commission" means the Texas Transportation
- 11 Commission].
- 12 (2) "Department" means the Texas Department of
- 13 Transportation.
- 14 (3) "Director" means the executive director of the

- SECTION 2. Section 201.003, Transportation Code, is amended
- by amending Subsections (b), (d), and (e) and adding Subsection (f)
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 (b) A reference in law to the State Highway Commission, the

- 21 the Texas Transportation Commission means the commissioner of

- 23 (d) A reference in law to the chair of the Texas

- 7 SECTION 3. Section 201.051, Transportation Code, is amended

- 12 association of automobile dealers is not eligible for election or
- 13 appointment as commissioner [may not be a member of the

- 15 $\underline{\text{(d)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(g)}}{\text{)}}$] The spouse of an officer, manager, or paid
- 16 consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of road
- 17 construction or maintenance, aviation, or outdoor advertising or a
- 18 Texas association of automobile dealers is not eligible for
- 19 election or appointment as commissioner [may not be a member of the

- 21 <u>(e)</u> [(h)] A person required to register as a lobbyist under
- 22 Chapter 305, Government Code, because of the person's activities
- for compensation on behalf of a profession related to the operation
- of the department is not eligible for election or appointment as
- 25 commissioner [may not serve as a member of the commission].
- 26 [(i) Appointments to the commission shall be made without
- 27 regard to race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or national

- origin of the appointees and shall reflect the diversity of the population of the state as a whole.
- (f) [(j)] In this section, "Texas trade association" means a nonprofit, cooperative, and voluntarily joined association of business or professional competitors in this state designed to assist its members and its industry or profession in dealing with mutual business or professional problems and in promoting their

- SECTION 4. Section 201.053, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 201.053. <u>DUTIES OF THE COMMISSIONER</u> [CHAIR OF THE COMMISSION]. [(a) The governor periodically shall designate one commissioner as the chair of the commission, who shall serve as presiding officer of the commission.

- [(8) create subcommittees, appoint commissioners to
 subcommittees, and receive the reports of subcommittees to the
 commission as a whole;
- [(9) appoint a commissioner to act in the chair's absence;] and
- 17 <u>(6)</u> [(10)] serve as the departmental liaison with the governor and the Office of State-Federal Relations to maximize federal funding for transportation.

SECTION 8. (a) The first commissioner of transportation elected under the changes in law made by this Act shall be elected at the general election held in November 2010 to serve for a term that begins January 1, 2011.

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- (b) Until the first commissioner of transportation elected under this Act takes office, the members of the Transportation Commission serving on the effective date of this Act shall, unless otherwise removed as provided by law, continue in office under the prior law that governed the composition of the Texas Transportation Commission, and that prior law is continued in effect for that purpose. If on January 1, 2011, there is a vacancy in the new office of commissioner of transportation created under this Act because the first commissioner of transportation-elect has died or refuses or is permanently unable to serve, the members of the Texas Transportation Commission serving on the effective date of this Act shall, unless otherwise removed as provided by law, continue in office under the prior law that governed composition of the Texas Transportation Commission until the governor fills the vacancy by appointment in the manner provided by The prior law that governed the composition of the Texas Transportation Commission is continued in effect for that purpose. At the time that the first commissioner of transportation that is elected, or in extraordinary circumstances appointed, under this Act takes office, the Texas Transportation Commission is abolished.
- (c) The commissioner of transportation succeeds to all powers, duties, rights, and obligations of the Texas Transportation Commission, and the abolition of the Texas Transportation

- 1 Commission does not affect the validity of any right, duty,
- 2 decision, rule, or action of any kind taken by or under the
- 3 authority of the commission.
- 4 (d) Not later than January 1, 2012, the commissioner of
- 5 transportation shall provide to the lieutenant governor, the
- 6 speaker of the house of representatives, and the presiding officers
- 7 of the standing committees of each house of the legislature with
- 8 primary jurisdiction over transportation issues:
- 9 (1) a strategic plan for the department; and
- 10 (2) a detailed plan describing how the department
- 11 intends to meet its goals.
- 12 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
