259.006. ENFORCEMENT. (a) The department may adopt rules to administer and enforce this chapter.

(b) A health care facility that violates Section 259.002 is subject to an administrative penalty, a civil penalty, or other disciplinary action, as applicable, in the same manner as if the facility violated the chapter under which the facility is licensed.

SECTION 2. A health care facility is not required to comply with Section 259.002, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, before September 1, 2010. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
