Sec. 30.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to a 22 23 hierarchical religious organization that has a factional 24 separation.

This Act applies to a factional separation of a 7 hierarchical religious organization as those terms are defined by 8 Section 30.001, Property Code, as added by this Act, occurring on or after the effective date of this Act. A factional separation of a 9 hierarchical religious organization as those terms are defined by 10 Section 30.001, Property Code, as added by this Act, that occurs 11 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in 12 effect on the date that the application was filed, and the former 13 14 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
