5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Title 2, Occupations Code, is amended by adding
7	Chapter 60 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 60. GENERAL LICENSING AND REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS
9	Sec. 60.001. INCLUSION OF NUMBER REQUIRED. An individual
10	who is required under the laws of this state to obtain a license or
11	certificate of registration issued by a state regulatory agency to
12	practice the individual's occupation shall prominently display the
13	individual's license or certificate number on any document,
14	advertisement, business card, or logo provided to the public.
15	Sec. 60.002. RULES. A state agency that regulates an
16	individual subject to Section 60.001 may adopt the rules necessary
17	to implement that section.
18	Sec. 60.003. CIVIL PENALTY. (a) An individual is liable to
19	this state for a civil penalty of not more than \$1,000 for each
20	violation if the individual:
21	(1) violates Section 60.001 or a rule adopted by a

- 4 (b) The amount of the penalty shall be based on:
- 5 (1) the seriousness of the violation;

- 10 (c) The attorney general may sue to collect a civil penalty
- 11 under this section. In the suit the attorney general may recover,
- 12 on behalf of the state, the reasonable expenses incurred in
- 13 obtaining the penalty, including investigation and court costs,
- 14 reasonable attorney's fees, witness fees, and other expenses.
- SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2009, a state
- 16 regulatory agency or the governing body of a state regulatory
- 17 agency, as appropriate, shall adopt the rules necessary to
- 18 implement Chapter 60, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Chapter 60, Occupations Code, as
- 20 added by this Act, an individual is not required to include the
- 21 individual's license or certificate number on documents provided to
- 22 the public before January 1, 2010.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
