## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to the restoration of the medically needy program under 3 the state Medicaid program.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 32.024(i), Human Resources Code, as 6 amended by Chapters 198 (H.B. 2292) and 1251 (S.B. 1862), Acts of 7 the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, is reenacted and 8 amended to read as follows:

9 (i) The [Subject to appropriated state funds, the] department in its adoption of rules shall establish a medically 10 needy program that serves pregnant women, children, and caretakers 11 12 who have high medical expenses. At a minimum, the program must serve recipients, including adult recipients, in the same manner 13 14 and at the same level that services were provided to recipients under the medically needy program during the state fiscal biennium 15 16 ending August 31, 2003.

SECTION 2. Not later than October 1, 2009, the executive 17 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall 18 adopt rules as necessary under Section 32.024(i), Human Resources 19 Code, as amended by Chapters 198 (H.B. 2292) and 1251 (S.B. 1862), 20 21 Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, and this Act, that, to the extent possible, are substantively identical to the 22 23 rules relating to the medically needy program that were in effect on 24 August 31, 2003.

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1 SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act 2 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a 3 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, 4 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or 5 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the 6 waiver or authorization is granted.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
