- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 12, Penal Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Section 12.50 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 12.50. PENALTIES FOR CERTAIN PROPERTY OFFENSES
- 8 COMMITTED DURING DISASTER. (a) Subject to Subsection (b), the
- 9 punishment for an offense under Chapter 28, 29, 30, or 31 is
- 10 increased to the punishment prescribed for the next highest
- 11 category of offense if it is shown on the trial of the offense that,
- 12 on the date the actor committed any element of the offense, the area
- 13 <u>in which the actor committed the offense was an area:</u>
- 14 (1) the governor declared under Section 418.014,
- 15 Government Code, to be under a state of disaster; or
- 16 (2) the governing body of a political subdivision
- 17 <u>declared under Section 418.108</u>, Government Code, to be under a
- 18 state of local disaster.
- 19 (b) If the offense for which punishment is increased under
- 20 this section is ordinarily punished as a Class A misdemeanor, the
- 21 offense remains a Class A misdemeanor the minimum term of
- 22 confinement for which is increased to 180 days.
- 23 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 24 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.

- 1 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 2 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the
- 3 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of
- 4 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of
- 5 this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
