A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a study concerning the establishment of a four-day work 3 week for state employees. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. FOUR-DAY WORK WEEK STUDY. (a) The comptroller of public accounts shall conduct a study on the establishment of a 6 four-day work week for state employees. 7 (b) In conducting the study, the comptroller shall 8 consider: 9 (1) the experience of other jurisdictions that have 10 11 instituted a four-day work week; 12 (2) expansion of existing variable work schedule 13 options for state employees; 14 (3) potential environmental, financial, and health benefits of establishing a four-day work week; and 15 any other information that the comptroller 16 (4) determines is necessary. 17 (c) At the comptroller's request, a state agency shall 18 provide information and assistance in conducting the study under 19 20 this section. 21 (d) Not later than December 10, 2010, the comptroller shall 22 report the results of the study conducted under this section to the 23 members and members-elect of the 82nd Legislature. 24 SECTION 2. EXPIRATION. This Act expires January 1, 2011.
