- prescribed by Section 143.023, to be certified as eligible for a 10
- beginning position with a police department, a person must be at 11
- 12 least 21 years of age at the end of the probationary period and

- served in the United States armed forces and 14 (1)
- received an honorable discharge; 15
- earned at least 60 hours' credit in any area of 16 (2)
- study at an accredited college or university, of which not more than 17
- 12 hours' credit may be earned for training at the police officer 18
- training academy operated or sponsored by the municipality; or 19
- 20 (3) been employed full-time for at least five years as
- a peace officer licensed by: 21
- 22 (A) the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer
- 23 Standards and Education; or
- an acceptable licensing entity in another 24 (B)
