In addition to meeting the eligibility requirements 9 prescribed by Section 143.023, to be certified as eligible for a 10 11 beginning position with a police department, a person must be at 12 least 21 years of age at the end of the probationary period and 13 have: served in the United States armed forces 14 (1)and received an honorable discharge; 15 earned at least 60 hours' credit in any area of 16 (2) study at an accredited college or university, of which not more than 17 12 hours' credit may be earned for training at the police officer 18 training academy operated or sponsored by the municipality; or 19 (3) been employed full-time for at least five years as 20 21 a peace officer licensed by: 22 (A) the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education; or 23 an acceptable licensing entity in another 24 (B)

1 state that has law enforcement officer licensing requirements 2 substantially equivalent to those of Chapter 1701, Occupations 3 Code.

4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 5 to a certification of eligibility for a beginning position in a 6 police department that occurs on or after the effective date of this 7 Act.
