1	AN ACT
2	relating to registration exemptions for certain foreign commercial
3	motor vehicles.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 648.001(4), Transportation Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(4) "Foreign commercial motor vehicle" means a
8	commercial motor vehicle, as defined by 49 C.F.R. Section 390.5,
9	that is owned [or controlled] by a person or entity that is
10	domiciled in or a citizen of a country other than the United States.

- 11 SECTION 2. Section 648.101, Transportation Code, is amended
- 12 by amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsections (d) and
- 13 (e) to read as follows:
- 14 (a) A foreign commercial motor vehicle is exempt from
- 15 Chapter 502 and any other law of this state requiring the vehicle to
- 16 be registered in this state, including a law providing for a
- 17 temporary registration permit, if:
- 18 (1) the vehicle is engaged solely in transportation of
- 19 cargo across the border into or from a border commercial zone;
- 20 (2) for each load of cargo transported the vehicle
- 21 remains in this state:
- 22 (A) not more than 24 hours; or
- 23 (B) not more than 48 hours, if:
- 24 (i) the vehicle is unable to leave this

- 1 state within 24 hours because of circumstances beyond the control
- 2 of the motor carrier operating the vehicle; and
- 3 (ii) all financial responsibility
- 4 requirements applying to the vehicle are satisfied;
- 5 (3) the vehicle is registered and licensed as required
- 6 by the [law of another] country in which the person that owns the
- 7 vehicle is domiciled or is a citizen as evidenced by a valid metal
- 8 license plate attached to the front or rear of the exterior of the
- 9 vehicle; and
- 10 (4) the country in which the person that owns [$\frac{\partial \mathbf{r}}{\partial \mathbf{r}}$
- 11 controls] the vehicle is domiciled or is a citizen provides a
- 12 reciprocal exemption for commercial motor vehicles owned [or
- 13 controlled] by residents of this state.
- 14 (c) A valid [Notwithstanding any] reciprocity agreement
- 15 between this state and another state of the United States or a
- 16 Canadian province that exempts currently registered vehicles owned
- 17 by nonresidents is effective in a border commercial zone.
- (d) A $\left[\frac{1}{7}\right]$ foreign commercial motor vehicle that engages
- 19 primarily in transportation of cargo across the border into or from
- 20 a border commercial zone must be:
- 21 (1) registered in this state; or
- 22 (2) operated under the exemption provided by this
- 23 section.
- (e) A vehicle located in a border commercial zone must
- 25 display a valid Texas registration if the vehicle is owned by a
- 26 person who:
- 27 (1) owns a leasing facility or a leasing terminal

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- 1 <u>located in this state; and</u>
- 2 (2) leases the vehicle to a foreign motor carrier.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
