A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the authority to charge reasonable fees for emergency services performed by volunteer fire departments. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 342, Local Government Code, is amended 5 by adding Subchapter D to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER D. CONTRACTS WITH VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENTS 7 Sec. 342.031. FEES FOR VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT SERVICES. 8 9 A municipality that contracts with a volunteer fire department for the performance of emergency services may charge a reasonable fee 10 for the emergency services performed by the department. The fee 11 12 must be paid within a reasonable amount of time established by the 13 municipality. 14 SECTION 2. Section 352.001(c), Local Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 15 16 (c) The commissioners court of a county may contract with an incorporated volunteer fire department that is located within the 17 county to provide fire protection to an area of the county that is 18 located outside the municipalities in the county. The court may pay 19 20 for that protection from the general fund of the county. The county

21 may charge a reasonable fee for emergency services performed by the

22 volunteer fire department under contract with the county. The fee

23 must be paid within a reasonable amount of time established by the

24 county. The county may assign the billing and collection of the fee

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1 to the volunteer fire department.

2 SECTION 3. Chapter 614, Government Code, is amended by 3 adding Subchapter L to read as follows:

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 SUBCHAPTER L. AUTHORITY OF CERTAIN VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENTS TO

<u>Sec. 614.211. FEES FOR VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT SERVICES.</u>
(a) In this section, "volunteer fire department" has the meaning
assigned by Section 614.071.

9 (b) A volunteer fire department that is not operating under 10 a contract with an emergency services district under Chapter 775, 11 Health and Safety Code, a county, a municipality, or another 12 political subdivision to provide emergency services may directly 13 charge a reasonable fee to the persons for whom the department 14 performs emergency services.

15 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply 16 beginning with emergency services performed by a volunteer fire 17 department on or after the effective date of this Act.

18 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
