3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 161, Human Resources Code, is amended by
5	adding Subchapter F to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER F. LIFESPAN RESPITE SERVICES PROGRAM
7	Sec. 161.151. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
8	(1) "Chronic serious health condition" means a health
9	<pre>condition that:</pre>
10	(A) requires periodic treatment by a health care
11	provider or a nurse or physician's assistant under the direct
12	supervision of a health care provider; and
13	(B) continues over an extended period, including
14	recurring episodes of a single underlying health condition such as
15	asthma, diabetes, epilepsy, or multiple sclerosis.
16	(2) "Respite services" means support services,
17	including in-home services or adult day-care services, that are
18	provided for the purpose of temporarily giving relief to a primary
19	caregiver who provides care to an individual with a chronic serious
20	health condition or disability.
21	(3) "Respite services coordinator" means a
22	community-based organization or local governmental entity with

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which the department enters into a contract to facilitate access to

respite services under Section 161.154.

- 1 Sec. 161.152. LIFESPAN RESPITE SERVICES PROGRAM. The
- 2 department shall implement the lifespan respite services program to
- 3 promote the provision of respite services through contracts with
- 4 eligible community-based organizations or local governmental
- 5 entities.
- 6 Sec. 161.153. ELIGIBILITY. (a) A person is eligible to
- 7 participate in the program if the person:
- 8 <u>(1) is the primary caregiver for a person who:</u>
- 9 (A) is related to the caregiver within the second

- 11 (B) has a chronic serious health condition or
- 12 disability;

- 15 (3) implement public awareness activities regarding

- 17 Sec. 161.156. RULES. The executive commissioner shall adopt
- 18 rules necessary to implement this subchapter.
- 19 SECTION 2. Not later than November 1, 2010, the executive
- 20 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission, in
- 21 consultation with the Department of Aging and Disability Services,
- 22 shall submit a report to the governor and the Legislative Budget
- 23 Board regarding the lifespan respite services program established
