4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 541.201(13-a), Transportation Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(13-a) "Police vehicle" means a vehicle [of a
8	governmental entity] primarily used by a peace officer, as defined
9	by Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, for law enforcement
10	purposes that:
11	(A) is owned or leased by a governmental entity;
12	or
13	(B) is a private vehicle used by the peace
14	officer that:
15	(i) is approved for use for law enforcement
16	purposes by the head of the law enforcement agency that employs the
17	peace officer, or by that person's designee; and
18	(ii) if applicable, complies with any rule
19	adopted by the commissioners court of a county under Section
20	170.001, Local Government Code.
21	SECTION 2. Section 228.054(a), Transportation Code, is
22	amended to read as follows:
23	(a) Except as provided by Subsection (e), the operator of a
24	vehicle, other than an authorized emergency vehicle, [as defined by

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Section 541.201,] that is driven or towed through a toll collection 1 facility shall pay the proper toll. The exemption from payment of 2 a toll for an authorized emergency vehicle applies regardless of 3 whether the vehicle is: 4 5 (1)responding to an emergency; 6 (2) displaying a flashing light; or 7 marked as an emergency vehicle. (3) 8 SECTION 3. Section 284.070, Transportation Code, is amended by amending Subsection (e) and adding Subsection (f) to read as 9 follows: 10 An authorized emergency vehicle [, as defined by Section 11 (e) 12 541.201,] is exempt from payment of a toll imposed under this chapter regardless of whether the vehicle is: 13 14 (1)responding to an emergency; 15 (2) displaying a flashing light; or 16 marked as an emergency vehicle. (3) (f) In this section, "authorized emergency vehicle" has the 17 meaning assigned by Section 541.201. 18 SECTION 4. Section 366.178, Transportation Code, is amended 19 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (j) to read as 20 follows: 21 (a) A motor vehicle other than an authorized emergency 2.2 vehicle[, as defined by Section 541.201,] that passes through a 23 24 toll collection facility, whether driven or towed, shall pay the proper toll. The exemption from payment of a toll for an

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25 proper toll. The exemption from payment of a toll for an 26 authorized emergency vehicle applies regardless of whether the 27 vehicle is:

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1 (1) responding to an emergency; displaying a flashing light; or 2 (2) marked as a police or emergency vehicle. 3 (3) 4 In this section, "authorized emergency vehicle" has the (j) 5 meaning assigned by Section 541.201. SECTION 5. Sections 370.177(a) and (k), 6 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows: 7 8 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (a-1), the operator of 9 a vehicle, other than an authorized emergency vehicle [as defined by Section 541.201], that is driven or towed through a toll 10 collection facility of a turnpike project shall pay the proper 11 The operator of a vehicle who drives or tows a vehicle 12 toll. through a toll collection facility and does not pay the proper toll 13 commits an offense. An offense under this subsection is a 14 15 misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$250. The exemption from payment of a toll for an authorized emergency vehicle applies 16 17 regardless of whether the vehicle is: (1) responding to an emergency; 18 displaying a flashing light; or 19 (2) marked as an emergency vehicle. 20 (3) 21 (k) In this section: 22 (1) "Authorized emergency vehicle" has the meaning 23 assigned by Section 541.201. 24 (2) "Registered [, "registered] owner" means the owner 25 of a vehicle as shown on the vehicle registration records of the 26 department or the analogous department or agency of another state 27 or country.

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1 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
