9	commits an offense if the person possesses a glass container within
10	the boundaries of a state-owned riverbed. An offense under this
11	section is a Class C misdemeanor unless it is shown on the trial of
12	the defendant that the defendant has previously been convicted of
13	an offense under this section, in which case the offense is a Class
14	B misdemeanor.
15	(b) It is a defense to prosecution under Subsection (a) that
16	the person who possessed the glass container:
17	(1) did not transport the glass container into the
18	boundaries of the riverbed; or

- (c) It is an exception to the application of Subsection (a) 22
