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1 the amount to which the district would have been entitled under that 2 chapter, based on the funding elements in effect for the 2005-2006 3 school year, if the district imposed a maintenance and operations 4 tax at the rate adopted by the district for the 2005 tax year; or

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5 (C) the amount of state and local revenue per student in weighted average daily attendance for the maintenance 6 and operations of the district to which the district would have been 7 8 entitled for the 2006-2007 school year under this chapter, as it existed on January 1, 2006, or, if the district would have been 9 10 subject to Chapter 41, as that chapter existed on January 1, 2006, the amount to which the district would have been entitled under that 11 chapter, based on the funding elements in effect for the 2005-2006 12 13 school year, if the district imposed a maintenance and operations 14 tax at the rate equal to the rate described by Section 26.08(i) or 15 (k)(1), Tax Code, as applicable, for the 2006 tax year;

16 amount (2) an equal to the product of \$2,500 17 multiplied the number of classroom teachers, full-time by librarians, full-time counselors certified under Subchapter B, 18 19 Chapter 21, and full-time school nurses employed by the district and entitled to a minimum salary under Section 21.402; 20 and

(3) an amount equal to the product of \$275 multiplied
