(a) In this section, "coordinating board" means the Texas 10 11 Higher Education Coordinating Board. 12 (b) A student who enrolls as a first-time freshman at an institution of higher education and who completes the first two 13 14 semesters or summer terms for which the student is enrolled at an institution of higher education is entitled to a rebate of the 15 16 tuition paid by the student under this chapter for those semesters or terms if the student: 17 18 (1) graduated from: 19 (A) a public high school in this state; (B) a private high school in this state, 20 21 including a home school; or 22 (C) a high school operated by the United States 23 Department of Defense; 24 (2) is a resident of this state for purposes of this

2 (2) additional eligibility requirements in accordance
3 with Subsection (b)(5).

4 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 5 may adopt initial rules under Section 54.0061, Education Code, as 6 added by this Act, in the manner provided by law for emergency 7 rules.

8 SECTION 3. Section 54.0061, Education Code, as added by 9 this Act, does not apply to a student who first enrolled in an 10 institution of higher education before the 2009 fall semester.

11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
