4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 10, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 2060 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 2060. MINORITY IMPACT STATEMENTS FOR STATE AGENCY GRANTS
8	Sec. 2060.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Disabled individual" means an individual who has
10	a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits at least
11	one major life activity, who has a record of the impairment, or who
12	is regarded as having or having had the impairment.
13	(2) "Major life activity" includes functions such as
14	caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing,
15	hearing, speaking, breathing, learning, or working.
16	(3) "Minority individual" includes a disabled
17	individual and an individual who is a woman, African American,
18	Latino, Asian, Pacific Islander, American Indian, or Alaska Native.
19	(4) "State agency" means an office, board, commission,
20	agency, or other entity in the executive, judicial, or legislative

Sec. 2060.002. MINORITY IMPACT STATEMENT REQUIRED. An

- 1 form created under Section 2060.003 that contains:
- 2 (1) information about any disproportionate or unique
- 3 impact on minority individuals in this state by proposed policies
- 4 or programs funded by the grant;
- 5 (2) a rationale for the existence of any policies or
- 6 programs described by Subdivision (1); and
- 7 (3) evidence of consultation with representatives of
- 8 minority individuals regarding a policy or program described by
- 9 Subdivision (1).
- Sec. 2060.003. CREATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF FORM. The
- 11 office of the governor shall create the minority impact statement
- 12 form, distribute the form to state agencies, and ensure that state
- 13 agencies include the form with other grant application forms.
- 14 Sec. 2060.004. COORDINATION WITH FEDERAL LAW. This chapter
- 15 applies to a grant applicant to the extent consistent with federal
- 16 law.
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 2060, Government Code, as added by this
- 18 Act, applies only to a grant application submitted to a state agency
- 19 on or after January 1, 2010.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
