## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the application of certain disability payments in
- 3 connection with a claim for child support arrearages.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 157, Family Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 157.009 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 157.009. AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE TO MOTION FOR ENFORCEMENT
- 8 OF CHILD SUPPORT: DISABILITY PAYMENTS. (a) This section applies
- 9 only to an obligor who has a disability and who is required to pay
- 10 support for a child who receives benefits as a result of the
- 11 obligor's disability.
- 12 (b) An obligor may plead as an affirmative defense in whole
- 13 or in part to a motion for enforcement of child support that the
- 14 obligor is entitled to an offset against the obligee's claim for
- 15 child support arrearages and interest. An offset under this
- 16 section is an amount equal to the amount of any benefit payments,
- 17 including lump-sum benefit payments, made as a result of the
- 18 obligor's disability to the obligee as the representative payee of
- 19 the child.
- 20 <u>(c) The offset permitted under this section may be applied</u>
- 21 only against arrearages and interest that accrued during the period
- 22 of the obligor's disability and that are not assigned to the Title
- 23 IV-D agency under Section 231.104(a).
- 24 (d) To the extent that this section conflicts with

- 1 Subchapter F, this section prevails.
- 2 SECTION 2. Section 157.009, Family Code, as added by this
- 3 Act, applies to a motion for enforcement of child support that is
- 4 pending before a trial court on or filed on or after the effective
- 5 date of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
