2	relating to inclusion on certain advertising documents of the
3	license or certificate of registration number of certain
4	individuals regulated by this state who solicit business in
5	consumers' homes; providing a civil penalty.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Title 2, Occupations Code, is amended by adding
8	Chapter 60 to read as follows:
9	CHAPTER 60. GENERAL LICENSING AND REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS
10	Sec. 60.001. SOLICITATION AT CONSUMER'S HOME. (a) In this
11	section, "solicit business" means to advertise an individual's
12	business practice, for which the individual is required to hold a
13	license or certificate of registration issued by a state regulatory
14	agency, to a consumer at the consumer's home, in person, for the
15	purpose of closing a sale or entering into a service agreement or
16	service contract with the consumer in the home.
17	(b) A state regulatory agency that determines that the
18	individuals licensed or registered by the agency solicit business
19	in consumers' homes as a regular business practice shall adopt

rules requiring each individual licensed or registered by the

agency to prominently display the individual's license or

certificate of registration number and the individual's signature

on any document evidencing the sale or any service agreement or

service contract that is provided by the individual to the

- 2 (c) An individual who holds a license or certificate of
- 3 registration issued by a state regulatory agency that adopts rules
- 4 under Subsection (b) shall prominently display the individual's
- 5 license or certificate number and the individual's signature on the
- 6 document evidencing the sale or the service agreement or service
- 7 contract that is provided by the individual to the consumer.
- 8 Sec. 60.002. EXEMPTION. This chapter does not apply to:
- 9 (1) an individual employed by or acting on behalf of an
- 10 entity that holds a license or certificate of registration issued
- 11 by the Public Utility Commission of Texas;
- 12 (2) an entity controlling, controlled by, or under the
- 13 same common control as an entity that holds a license or certificate
- 14 of registration issued by the Public Utility Commission of Texas;
- 15 <u>or</u>
- 16 (3) an insurance agent licensed under Subtitle B,
- 17 Title 13, Insurance Code, other than an agent licensed to solicit
- 18 life, accident, and health insurance coverage who offers for sale
- 19 in the consumer's home a Medicare Advantage Plan.
- Sec. 60.003. CIVIL PENALTY. (a) An individual is liable to
- 21 this state for a civil penalty of not more than \$1,000 for each
- 22 violation if the individual:
- 23 (1) violates Section 60.001 or a rule adopted by a
- 24 state regulatory agency to enforce that section;
- 25 (2) represents that an expired license or certificate
- 26 of registration issued by a state regulatory agency is valid; or
- 27 (3) displays a counterfeit license or certificate of

- 1 registration or uses a counterfeit license or certificate number in
- 2 any document provided to the public.
- 3 (b) The amount of the penalty shall be based on:
- 4 (1) the seriousness of the violation;
- 5 (2) the history of previous violations;
- 6 (3) the amount necessary to deter a future violation;
- 7 and
- 8 (4) any other matter that justice may require.
- 9 (c) The attorney general may sue to collect a civil penalty
- 10 under this section. In the suit the attorney general may recover,
- 11 on behalf of the state, the reasonable expenses incurred in
- 12 obtaining the penalty, including investigation and court costs,
- 13 reasonable attorney's fees, witness fees, and other expenses.
- 14 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2009, a state
- 15 regulatory agency or the governing body of a state regulatory
- 16 agency, as appropriate, to which Chapter 60, Occupations Code, as
- 17 added by this Act, applies shall adopt the rules necessary to
- 18 implement that chapter.
- 19 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Chapter 60, Occupations Code, as
- 20 added by this Act, an individual subject to that chapter is not
- 21 required to include the individual's license or certificate number
- 22 on documents provided to the public before January 1, 2010.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
