A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to requiring certain service stations to be capable of
3	operating with alternative electrical power and to have an
4	alternative electrical generator; providing a criminal penalty.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 5, Business & Commerce Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 106 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 106. ALTERNATIVE ELECTRICAL POWER REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN
9	SERVICE STATIONS
10	Sec. 106.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Alternative electrical generator" means an
12	electrical generator that provides electric power when electric
13	power from a utility service is interrupted.
14	(2) "Department" means the Texas Department of
15	Agriculture.
16	(3) "Service station" has the meaning assigned by
17	Section 105.001.
18	Sec. 106.002. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER. (a) This chapter
19	applies only to a self-service, full-service, or combination of
20	self-service and full-service service station that:
21	(1) is located within 100 miles of the Gulf of Mexico
22	or of a bay or inlet of the gulf; and
23	(2) has seven or more fueling positions.
24	(b) This chapter applies to a service station described by

- 1 Subsection (a) regardless of whether the service station is located
- 2 on the grounds of, or is owned by, another business entity that does
- 3 not engage in the business of selling motor vehicle fuel to the
- 4 public.
- 5 <u>(c)</u> This chapter does not apply to:
- 6 <u>(1) an automobile dealer;</u>
- 7 (2) a person who operates a fleet of motor vehicles; or
- 8 (3) a person who sells motor vehicle fuel exclusively
- 9 to a fleet of motor vehicles.
- 10 Sec. 106.003. ALTERNATIVE ELECTRICAL POWER CAPACITY FOR
- 11 SERVICE STATIONS. (a) A service station shall be prewired with an
- 12 appropriate transfer switch and be capable of operating all fuel
- 13 pumps, dispensing equipment, and life-safety systems using an
- 14 alternative electrical generator.
- 15 (b) Installation of appropriate wiring and transfer
- 16 switches must be performed by an electrical contractor.
- 17 (c) If a local government requires a certificate of
- 18 occupancy for completion of construction of a service station, the
- 19 local government may not issue a certificate of occupancy to the
- 20 service station unless the local government determines that the
- 21 service station has the equipment and operational capabilities
- 22 <u>required by Subsection (a).</u>
- Sec. 106.004. ALTERNATIVE ELECTRICAL GENERATOR REQUIRED. A
- 24 service station shall be equipped with at least one alternative
- 25 <u>electrical generator for use at the station and be capable of</u>
- 26 operating all fuel pumps, dispensing equipment, and life-safety
- 27 systems using an alternative electrical generator for a minimum of

- 1 <u>72 hours.</u>
- 2 Sec. 106.005. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR SERVICE STATIONS. (a)
- 3 A service station must keep a copy of the documentation of the
- 4 installation of appropriate wiring for the operation of an
- 5 alternative electrical generator, including a transfer switch,
- 6 on-site or at its corporate headquarters.
- 7 (b) A service station must keep a written statement
- 8 attesting to the periodic testing and ensured operational capacity
- 9 of the equipment.
- 10 <u>(c) The documents required by this section must be made</u>
- 11 available, on request, to the department.
- Sec. 106.006. ADMINISTRATION; RULES. The department shall:
- 13 (1) administer and enforce the provisions of this
- 14 chapter; and
- 15 (2) adopt rules as necessary for the administration
- 16 <u>and enforcement of this chapter.</u>
- 17 Sec. 106.007. PENALTY. A person who violates this chapter
- 18 commits an offense. An offense under this section is a Class C
- 19 misdemeanor.
- 20 SECTION 2. A newly constructed service station that begins
- 21 operating on or after the effective date of this Act shall comply
- 22 with Chapter 106, Business & Commerce Code, as added by this Act,
- 23 beginning on the first day of operation. A service station
- 24 operating before the effective date of this Act shall comply with
- 25 Chapter 106, Business & Commerce Code, as added by this Act,
- 26 beginning on the later of June 1, 2010, or the first day of
- 27 operation after replacing a fuel pump.

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1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect June 1, 2010.
