- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 2155, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 2155.454 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 2155.454. PREFERENCE TO GOODS FROM DISASTER AREA. (a)
- 8 <u>In this section, "disaster area" means an area of this state that</u>
- 9 has been declared a disaster area by:
- 10 (1) the governor under Chapter 418; or
- 11 (2) the president of the United States under the
- 12 Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42
- 13 <u>U.S.C. Section 5121 et seq.).</u>
- 14 (b) The comptroller and each state agency procuring goods
- 15 shall give preference to goods produced in a disaster area if:
- 16 (1) the cost of the goods does not exceed the cost of
- 17 other similar goods that are not produced in a disaster area; and
- 18 (2) the quality of the goods equals or exceeds the
- 19 quality of other similar goods that are not produced in a disaster
- 20 area.
- 21 (c) The preference required by this section applies
- 22 beginning on the date the area is first declared to be a disaster
- 23 area and ending on the first anniversary of that date, regardless of
- 24 the date the declaration terminates or expires.

- 1 (d) The comptroller and each state agency procuring goods
- 2 shall adopt rules to implement this section.
- 3 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 4 of this Act, the comptroller of public accounts and each state
- 5 agency procuring goods shall adopt rules necessary to implement
- 6 Section 2155.454, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
