- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 164.007(a) and (a-1), Occupations Code,
- 7 are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The board by rule shall adopt procedures governing
- 9 formal disposition of a contested case under Chapter 2001,
- 10 Government Code. A formal hearing shall be conducted by an
- 11 administrative law judge employed by the State Office of
- 12 Administrative Hearings. After receiving the administrative law
- 13 judge's findings of fact and conclusions of law, the board shall
- 14 dispose of the contested case by issuing a final order based on the
- 15 administrative law judge's findings of fact and conclusions of law
- 16 [determine the charges on the merits].
- 17 (a-1) Notwithstanding Section 2001.058(e), Government
- 18 <u>Code, the</u> [The] board may <u>not</u> change a finding of fact or conclusion
- 19 of law or vacate or modify an order of the administrative law judge,
- 20 including an order recommending or imposing a sanction [only if the
- 21 board makes a determination required by Section 2001.058(e),
- 22 Government Code].
- SECTION 2. Sections 164.007(a) and (a-1), Occupations Code,
- 24 as amended by this Act, apply only to a contested case for which an

- 1 administrative law judge employed by the State Office of
- 2 Administrative Hearings issues written findings of fact and
- 3 conclusions of law on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 4 contested case for which an administrative law judge employed by
- 5 the State Office of Administrative Hearings issues written findings
- 6 of fact and conclusions of law before the effective date of this Act
- 7 is governed by the law in effect on the date the findings of fact and
- 8 conclusions of law were issued, and the former law is continued in
- 9 effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
