A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 109.59(b), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) On the sale or transfer of the premises or the business
- 9 on the premises in which a new original license or permit is
- 10 required for the premises, the premises shall be deemed to satisfy
- 11 any distance requirements as if the issuance of the new original
- 12 permit or license were a renewal of a previously held permit or
- 13 license if the new permit or license is of the same type as the
- 14 previously held permit or license.
- SECTION 2. Section 38.007(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 (b) The board of trustees of a school district shall attempt
- 18 to provide a safe alcohol-free environment to students coming to or
- 19 going from school. The board of trustees may cooperate with local
- 20 law enforcement officials and the Texas Alcoholic Beverage
- 21 Commission in attempting to provide this environment and in
- 22 enforcing Sections 101.75, 109.33, and 109.59, Alcoholic Beverage
- 23 Code. Additionally, the board [, if a majority of the area of a
- 24 district is located in a municipality with a population of 900,000

- 1 or more, may petition the commissioners court of the county in
- 2 which the district is located or the governing board of an
- 3 incorporated city or town in which the district is located to adopt
- 4 a 1,000-foot zone under Section 109.33, Alcoholic Beverage Code.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 109.59(c), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 6 repealed.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
