## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to increasing the number of undergraduate transfer
3 students at general academic teaching institutions.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 51.808, Education Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsections (b-1), 7 (b-2), and (d) to read as follows:

8 (a) Each general academic teaching institution or medical 9 and dental unit that offers [admissions to undergraduate transfer 10 students or] admissions to a graduate, postgraduate, or 11 professional program shall adopt a written admission policy 12 applicable to those programs.

13 (b) Each general academic teaching institution shall adopt 14 written admission policy to promote the admission а of undergraduate transfer students to the institution. The policy 15 16 must provide for outreach and recruiting efforts directed at junior colleges and other lower-division institutions of higher education 17 and may include incentives to encourage transfer applications and 18 to retain and promote transfer students. The policy must provide 19 20 for a number of undergraduate transfer students to be admitted to 21 the institution so that, of the undergraduate students enrolled at the institution, at least 33.3 percent are transfer students who 22 23 have completed at least 15 semester credit hours at a junior 24 college.

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1 (b-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (b): 2 (1) the requirement prescribed by that subsection regarding the percentage of undergraduate students who must be 3 transfer students does not apply before the 2014 fall semester; and 4 (2) for the 2012-2013 and 2013-2014 academic years, 5 6 the policy required by Subsection (b) must provide for a number of 7 undergraduate transfer students to be admitted to the institution 8 so that, of the undergraduate students enrolled at the institution, at least 30 percent are transfer students. 9 (b-2) Subsection (b-1) and this subsection expire January 10 1, 2014. 11 12 (d) On application of a general academic teaching institution, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may 13 14 waive or modify a requirement of this section that a certain 15 percentage of the institution's undergraduate student body must consist of transfer students if the coordinating board determines 16 that the requirement would impose an undue hardship on the 17 institution. 18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22

23 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
