BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 261.201, Family Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsection (g) and adding Subsection (g-1) to read as 7 follows:

(g) Notwithstanding Subsection (a) [(b)], the department or 8 9 a law enforcement agency investigating a report of abuse or neglect, on request [and subject to department rule], shall provide 10 to the child and the parent, managing conservator, or other legal 11 representative of the [a] child who is the subject of reported abuse 12 or neglect information concerning the reported abuse or neglect 13 14 that would otherwise be confidential under this section. The [if the] department or law enforcement agency shall withhold 15 information under this subsection if the parent, managing 16 conservator, or other legal representative of the child requesting 17 the information is alleged to have committed the abuse or neglect. 18

19 (g-1) Before a child or a parent, managing conservator, or 20 other legal representative of a child may inspect or copy a record 21 or file concerning the child under Subsection (g), the custodian of 22 the record or file must redact:

23 (1) any personally identifiable information about a
24 victim or witness under 18 years of age unless that victim or

1	witness is:
2	(A) the child under Subsection (g); or
3	(B) another child of the parent, managing
4	conservator, or other legal representative requesting the
5	information;
6	(2) any information that is excepted from required
7	disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code, or other law; and
8	(3) [has edited the information to protect the
9	confidentiality of] the identity of the person who made the report
10	of abuse or neglect [and any other person whose life or safety may
11	be endangered by the disclosure].
12	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
