1 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter and 2 except as provided by Subsection (e), an eligible barrier island 3 coastal municipality shall use at least the amount of revenue 4 derived from the application of the tax at a rate of seven percent 5 of the cost of a room for the purposes authorized under Sections 6 351.101(a)(1) and (3).

7 (e) An eligible barrier island coastal municipality that 8 imposes the tax at a rate equal to or greater than 7-1/2 percent of 9 the price paid for a room shall use at least the amount of revenue 10 derived from the application of the tax at a rate of one-half of one 11 percent of the cost of a room for erosion response projects.

12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
