- 2 relating to responsibility for public school textbooks and
- 3 technological equipment and to failure by students to return
- 4 textbooks or technological equipment.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 31.104(d), Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (d) Each student, or the student's parent or guardian, is
- 9 responsible for each textbook, including an electronic textbook,
- 10 <u>and all technological equipment</u> not returned <u>in an acceptable</u>
- 11 $\underline{\text{condition}}$ by the student. A student who fails to return $\underline{\text{in an}}$
- 12 <u>acceptable condition</u> all textbooks, including electronic
- 13 textbooks, and technological equipment forfeits the right to free
- 14 textbooks, including electronic textbooks, and technological
- 15 <u>equipment</u> until each textbook, including an electronic textbook,
- 16 <u>and all technological equipment</u> previously issued but not returned
- $\underline{\text{in an acceptable condition}}$ is paid for by the student, parent, or
- 18 guardian. As provided by policy of the board of trustees or
- 19 governing body, a school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 20 may waive or reduce the payment requirement if the student is from a
- 21 low-income family. The district or school shall allow the student
- 22 to use textbooks, including electronic textbooks, and
- 23 <u>technological equipment</u> at school during each school day. If a
- 24 textbook, including an electronic textbook, or technological

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- 1 equipment is not returned in an acceptable condition or paid for,
- 2 the district or school may withhold the student's records. A
- 3 district or school may not, under this subsection, prevent a
- 4 student from graduating, participating in a graduation ceremony, or
- 5 receiving a diploma. The commissioner by rule shall adopt criteria
- 6 for determining whether a textbook, including an electronic
- 7 textbook, and technological equipment are returned in an acceptable
- 8 condition.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
- 10 school year.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
