## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to responsibility for public school textbooks and
- 3 technological equipment and to failure by students to return
- 4 textbooks or technological equipment.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 31.104(d), Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (d) Each student, or the student's parent or guardian, is
- 9 responsible for each textbook, including an electronic textbook,
- 10 and all technological equipment not returned by the student. A
- 11 student who fails to return all textbooks, including electronic
- 12 <u>textbooks</u>, and technological equipment forfeits the right to free
- 13 textbooks, including electronic textbooks, and technological
- 14 equipment until each textbook, including an electronic textbook,
- 15 and all technological equipment previously issued but not returned
- 16 is paid for by the student, parent, or guardian. As provided by
- 17 policy of the board of trustees or governing body, a school district
- 18 or open-enrollment charter school may waive or reduce the payment
- 19 requirement if the student is from a low-income family. The
- 20 district or school shall allow the student to use textbooks  $\underline{\prime}$
- 21 <u>including electronic textbooks</u>, and technological equipment at
- 22 school during each school day. If a textbook, including an
- 23 <u>electronic textbook</u>, or technological equipment is not returned or
- 24 paid for, the district or school may withhold the student's

- 1 records. A district or school may not, under this subsection,
- 2 prevent a student from graduating, participating in a graduation
- 3 ceremony, or receiving a diploma.
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
- 5 school year.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
