Section 102.001(3), Health and Safety Code, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 (3) "Research and prevention programs committee" 6 means the Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas 7 Scientific Research and Prevention Programs committees appointed 8 9 by the executive director [Committee]. SECTION 2. Section 102.151, Health and Safety Code, is 10 11 amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows: 12 (a-1) The executive director shall appoint as members of scientific research and prevention programs committees experts in 13 14 the field of cancer research and prevention. SECTION 3. The heading to Subchapter D, Chapter 102, Health 15 and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 16 SUBCHAPTER D. COMMITTEES [RESEARCH AND PREVENTION PROGRAMS 17 18 COMMITTEE] SECTION 4. Section 102.153, Health and Safety Code, is 19 20 amended to read as follows: 21 Sec. 102.153. EXPENSES. Members of the university advisory committee or any ad hoc advisory committee appointed under this 22 23 subchapter [the research and prevention programs committee] serve without compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for actual 24

1 and necessary expenses in attending meetings of the committee or performing other official duties authorized by the presiding 2 3 officer. 4 SECTION 5. Subchapter D, Chapter 102, Health and Safety 5 Code, is amended by adding Sections 102.154, 102.155, and 102.156 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 102.154. UNIVERSITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) 7 The Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas University 8 Advisory Committee is composed of the following nine members: 9 10 (1) two members appointed by the governor representing private or independent institutions of higher education in this 11 12 state that have demonstrated success and leadership in cancer 13 research; 14 (2) two members appointed by the chancellor of The 15 University of Texas System to represent: 16 (A) The University of Texas Southwestern Medical 17 Center at Dallas; The University of Texas Medical Branch at 18 (B) 19 Galveston; 20 (C) The University of Texas Health Science Center 21 at Houston; The University of Texas Health Science Center 22 (D) 23 at San Antonio; 24 (E) The University of Texas Health Center at Tyler; or 25 26 (F) The University of Texas M. No. 1358 subchapter shall disclose in writing to the executive director if 1 the member has an interest in the matter or has a substantial 2 3 financial interest in an entity that has a direct interest in the 4 matter. 5 (b) The member shall recuse himself or herself from the committee's deliberations and actions on the matter in Subsection 6 7 (a) and may not participate in the committee's decision on the 8 matter. 9 (c) A person has a substantial financial interest in an 10 entity if the person: (1) is an employee, member, director, or officer of 11 12 the entity; or (2) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more 13 14 than a five percent interest in the entity. SECTION 6. Sections 102.203(c) and (d), Health and Safety 15 Code, are amended to read as follows: 16 17 (c) A person receiving money under this subchapter for cancer research may not spend more than five percent of the money 18 19 for indirect costs. For purposes of this subsection, "indirect costs" means the expenses of doing business that are not readily 20 identified with a particular grant, contract, project, function, or 21 activity, but are necessary for the general operation of the 22 23 organization or the performance of the organization's activities. 24 (d) Not more than five percent of the money awarded under this subchapter may be used for facility purchase, construction, 25 26 remodel, or renovation purposes during any year. Expenditures of money awarded under this subchapter for facility purchase, 27

1 construction, remodel, or renovation projects must benefit cancer 2 prevention and research.

3 SECTION 7. Section 102.251, Health and Safety Code, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Sec. 102.251. <u>RULES FOR GRANT AWARD PROCEDURE</u> [DUTIES OF 6 <u>SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH AND PREVENTION PROGRAMS COMMITTEE</u>]. (a) <u>The</u> 7 <u>oversight committee shall issue rules regarding the procedure for</u> 8 <u>awarding grants to an applicant under this chapter. The rules must</u> 9 include the following procedures:

10 <u>(1) a [The]</u> research and prevention programs committee 11 shall review grant applications and make recommendations to the 12 <u>executive director</u> [oversight committee] regarding the award of 13 <u>cancer</u> research <u>grants</u>, <u>including a prioritized list that ranks the</u> 14 <u>grant applications in the order the committee determines</u> 15 <u>applications should be funded</u>; and

16 (2) the executive director shall submit to the 17 oversight committee a list of grant applications that is 18 substantially based on the list submitted by the committee under 19 Subdivision (1) and, to the extent possible, gives[, therapy 20 development, and clinical trial grants.

[(b) The ex officio members of the research and prevention programs committee may participate in the review and discussion of grant applications but may not vote on recommendations to the oversight committee. In making recommendations to the oversight committee, the research and prevention programs committee shall give] priority to proposals that: (A) [(1)] could lead to immediate or long-term

3 (B) [(2)] strengthen and enhance fundamental
4 science in cancer research;

5 (C) [(3)] ensure a comprehensive coordinated 6 approach to cancer research;

7 <u>(D)</u> [(4)] are interdisciplinary or 8 interinstitutional;

9 <u>(E)</u> [(5)] address federal or other major 10 research sponsors' priorities in emerging scientific or technology 11 fields in the area of cancer prevention or cures for cancer;

12 <u>(F)</u> [(6)] are matched with funds available by a 13 private or nonprofit entity and institution or institutions of 14 higher education;

15 <u>(G)</u> [(7)] are collaborative between any 16 combination of private and nonprofit entities, public or private 17 agencies or institutions in this state, and public or private 18 institutions outside this state;

19 <u>(H)</u> [(8)] have a demonstrable economic
20 development benefit to this state;

21 <u>(I)</u> [(9)] enhance research superiority at institutions of higher education in this state by creating new 22 23 research superiority, attracting existing research superiority 24 from institutions not located in this state and other research entities, or enhancing existing research superiority by attracting 25 26 from outside this state additional researchers and resources; and (J) [(10)] expedite 27 innovation and

1 commercialization, attract, create, or expand private sector 2 entities that will drive a substantial increase in high-quality 3 jobs, and increase higher education applied science or technology 4 research capabilities.

5 (b) [(c)] A member of the research and prevention programs 6 committee may not attempt to use the committee member's official 7 position to influence a decision to approve or award a grant or 8 contract to the committee member's employer.

9 SECTION 8. Section 102.252, Health and Safety Code, is 10 amended to read as follows:

11 Sec. 102.252. OVERRIDING [RESEARCH AND PREVENTION PROGRAMS 12 COMMITTEE] RECOMMENDATIONS. The oversight committee must follow 13 the funding recommendations of the <u>executive director in the order</u> 14 <u>the executive director submits the applications to the oversight</u> 15 <u>committee</u> [research and prevention programs committee] unless 16 two-thirds of the members of the oversight committee vote to 17 disregard a recommendation.

SECTION 9. Section 102.255(d), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

(d) Before the oversight committee may make <u>for cancer</u> <u>research</u> any grant of any proceeds of the bonds issued under Subchapter E, the recipient of the grant must have an amount of funds equal to one-half of the grant dedicated to the research that is the subject of the grant request.

25 SECTION 10. Subchapter F, Chapter 102, Health and Safety 26 Code, is amended by adding Section 102.262 to read as follows:

9	SECTION 11. Section 102.151(a), Health and Safety Code, is
10	repealed.
11	SECTION 12. This Act takes effect immediately if it
12	receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
13	house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
14	If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate

15 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
