SUBCHAPTER C. DUTIES PERFORMED BY MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGES

5 SECTION 1. Chapter 49, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 6 amended by adding Subchapter C to read as follows:

Art. 49.51. POWERS AND DUTIES. A judge of a municipal court 8 9 may conduct an inquest under this chapter into the death of a person who dies in the municipality served by the judge to the same extent 10 a justice of the peace serving the precinct in which the body or 11 12 body part was found may conduct an inquest under Subchapter A into the death of that person. The municipal court judge may exercise 13 14 any power granted to, and shall perform any duty imposed on, the justice of the peace by Subchapter A or another law relating to 15 16 inquests conducted by a justice of the peace.

Art. 49.52. MUNICIPALITY'S GOVERNING BODY TO PAY CERTAIN 17 FEES. If a judge of a municipal court in exercising a power or 18 performing a duty under authority of this subchapter requests the 19 services or expertise of a person who would be entitled under 20 Subchapter A or other applicable law to be paid a fee for providing 21 the services or expertise to a justice of the peace, the governing 22 23 body of the municipality served by the municipal court judge shall pay the fee associated with providing the services or expertise to 24

the same extent a commissioners court is required to pay a fee for 1 2 the provision of those services or expertise if provided to a justice of the peace, including a fee described by Article 49.10(b) 3 4 or (g), 49.11(c), or 49.15(c). SECTION 2. Article 49.07, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 5 6 amended by adding Subsection (c-1) to read as follows: 7 (c-1) A person who is required by this subchapter to give notice to a justice of the peace or county judge may instead give 8 9 notice to a judge of a municipal court in the municipality in which the body or body part was found. 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
